Childress—Work will begin in mid July on the thermoplastic edge line striping contract awarded recently to Prismo Universal Corporation of Rockville, Maryland, announced Lewis H. White, district engineer for the Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

The striping is scheduled for sections of U. S. Highway 287 in Donley, Hall, Childress, and Hardeman Counties, and U. S. Highway 82 in Dickens County.

Highway safety for motorists in the work area was a major topic of discussion at the preconstruction conference held Thursday, May 27 1976, in Childress at the District Office between representatives of the DHT, Contractor, and Department of Public Safety.

Work is expected to be completed by September 1, 1976, if weather conditions are favorable.
