In the second primary here Saturday, 345 votes were cast. In the race for Precinct 3 commissioner, Buford Holland received 181 votes and Junior Hill 170. Truett Behrens received 184 votes for sheriff, and Frank Lindsey Jr 169. J. N. Newton received 161 votes for the railroad commissioner and Jerry Sadler 145. W. T. Phillips received 156 votes for judge of the court of criminal appeals, and Carl Dally 111.

At Lelia Lake Junior Hill received 40 votes and Buford Holland 32 making a total of 213 for Holland and 210 for Hill.

Over the county Behrens received 718 votes and Lindsey 557.

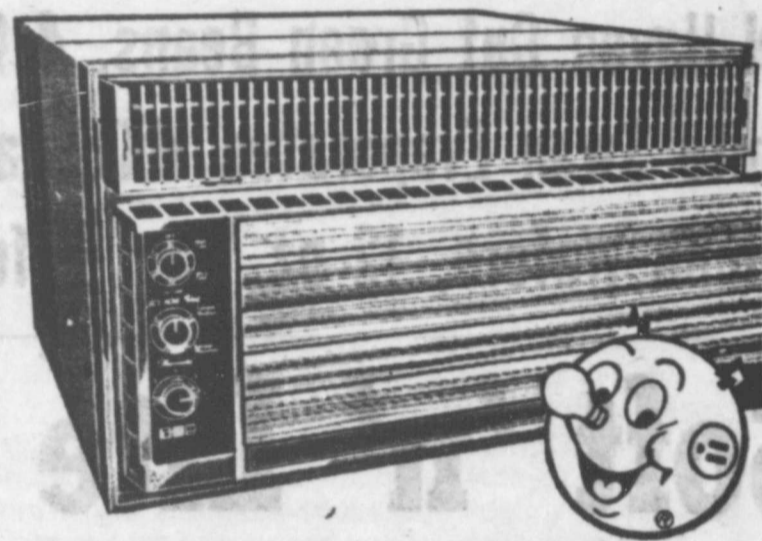
