



#### Ag Exemptions

Austin—Comptrolles Bob Bul ock says his office has rewritten sales tax procedures on agricultural exemptions to make them as easy to read as a mail-order cata-

The new procedures will be ef feetive about July 15, he said

The Comptroller said the procedures clarify the fact that the following items are exempt from the sales tax: expendable supplies such as hand tools baling wire, binders twine, hardware tires and lubricants for farm machinery; fences, pens, gates, cattle guards and chutes; and structures that can be considered a piece of equip ment, such as automated laying such as barns, garages, warehouses and family dwellings, are taxable, he saidi

Any farmer or rancher seeking ab exemption must have ah exemption certificate on file with the retailer at the time of pur. chases
