## School Lunch Program Register To Vote

The Hedley Schools today announced its policy for free and reduced lunches for children unable to pay the full price for meals served under the National School Lunch Program.

Children from families whose income meets those indicated on the attached charts are eligible for free meals. In addition, families not meeting these criteria but with other unusual expenses due to unusually high medical expenses, shelter costs in excess of 30% of income, special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of a child, and disaster casualty losses are urged to apply.

Application forms will be given to students when they enroll in classes. Additional copies are available at the principal's office. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a family has foster children living with them and wish to apply for free meals you should contact the school.

In the operation of this program no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color or national origin.

Under the provisions of the policy, the school will review all applications and determine eligibility.

Don't forget to register to vote, if you have not done so. Deadline is Oct 1.

If you have registered or voted this year, you do not need to register again.

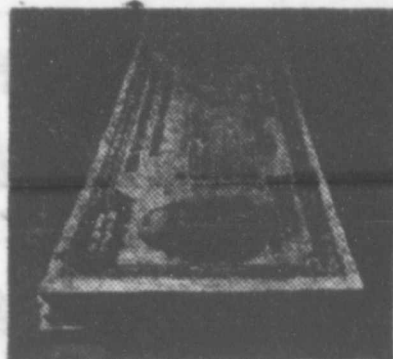

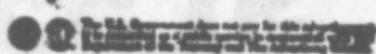

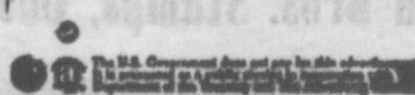
