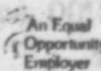
- ★ Utilize the washer's full capacity. Wash larger loads — wash less often.

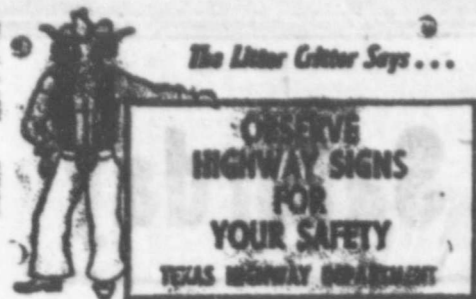

They laughed when I bought my first Bond.

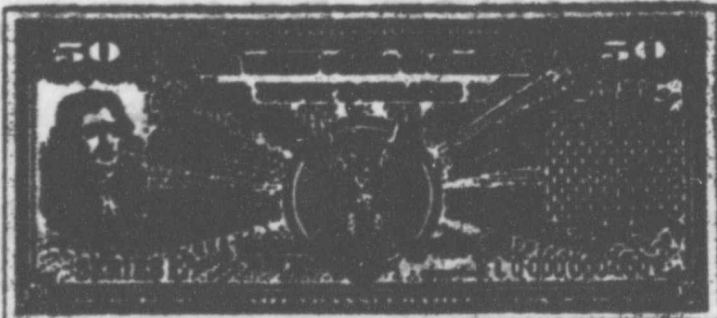
