The site consists of approximately 10 acres of land, and is to receive approximately 0.5 ton of municipal solid waste per day.

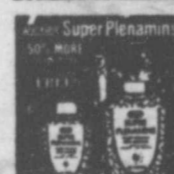

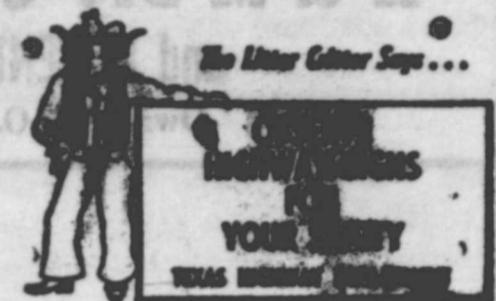

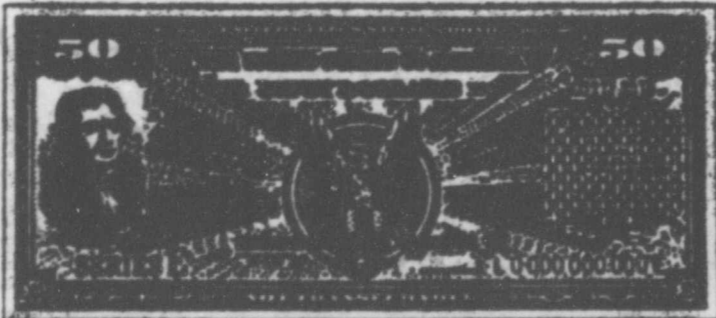
