Notice of Public Hearing

City of Hedley, Texas has filed Application No 289 with the Texas Department of Health Resources for a permit to operate an existing Type III municipal solid waste disposal site located 3.5 miles east of Hedley, 1.5 miles south of State Highway 203 about 900 yards east of a county road in Donley County, Texas.

The site consists of approximately 10 acres of land, and is to receive approximately 0.5 ton of municipal solid waste per day.

Pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act (Articles 4477-7, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes) and the Texas Department of Health Resources Municipal Solid Waste Management Regulations, and the Administrative Procedure and Texas Register Act, a public hearing on the aforesaid application will be held at:
