## Joint School and City Election

There will be a joint school and city election in the Hedley Lions Den on Saturday, April 2.

There will be two to elect for the school board for three years. Members whose terms expire this year are Martha Hill and H. E. Darbill.

There will be three aldermen to elect for the city, two for two year terms and one for one year. Aldermen whose terms expire this year are G. L. Taylor, Bill Wadell and W. B. Wiggins.

Any qualified citizen may run for these offices. Candidates for the school board should see Supt. Vernon Scott and candidates for the City Council should see City Secretary M. O. Weatherly.

Deadline to file for these offices is March 2.

## Laura Ann Wheatly Is General Mills Search Winner

Laura Ann Wheatly has been named Hedley's 1976-77 General Mills Family Leader of Tomorrow. Laura Ann Wheatly won the honor by competing with other students here in a written knowledge and attitude examination on Dec 7. She will receive a certificate from General Mills, sponsor of the annual educational scholarship program and become eligible for state and national honors.

The State Family Leader of Tomorrow, to be chosen through judging centered on performance in the Dec 7 test, will receive a \$1,500 college scholarship, with the second-ranking participant in the state receiving a \$500 grant. The state winner will also earn for his or her school a 20-volume reference work, "The Annals of America," from Encyclopedia Britannica Educational Corporation.

In April, the 51 winners representing every state and the District of Columbia will be the guests of General Mills on an expense paid educational tour of Colonial Williamsburg, Va., and Washington, D.C. During the tour, personal observations and interviews will be conducted to select the All-American Family Leader of Tomorrow, whose scholarship will be increased to \$5,000. Second, third and fourth place winners will receive scholarship increases to \$4,000, \$3,000 and \$2,000, respectively.

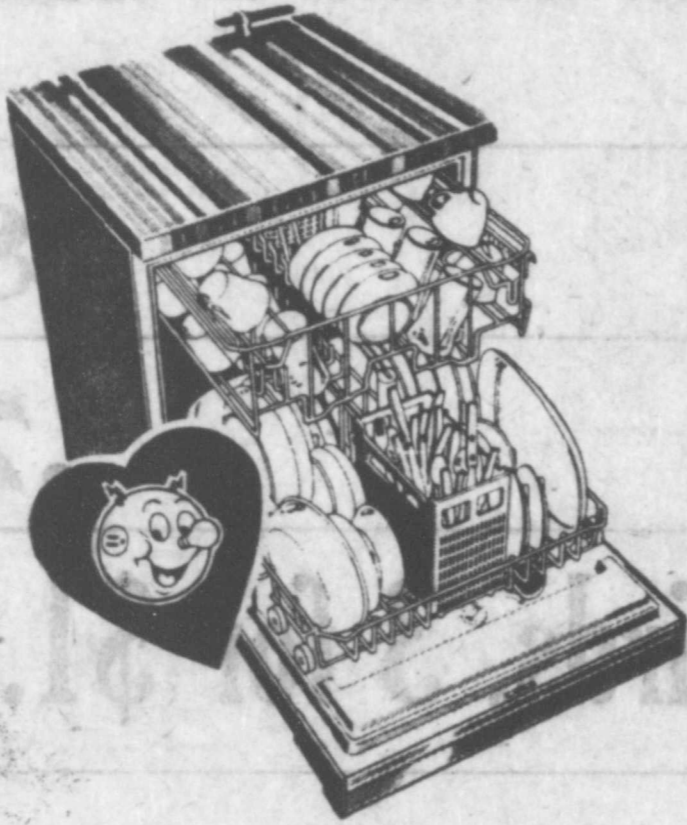
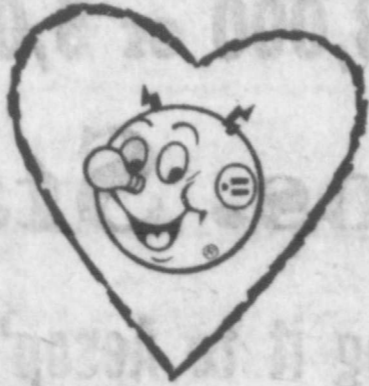
