## Texas On Way To No. 1 In Agriculture

Texas is making steady progress toward becoming the leading state in agricultural income, says the Director of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. A special campaign, "On Our Way to No. 1," was launched by the Extension Service in 1974. The target date is 1980 and the goal is \$8.436 billion. Agricultural income for 1976 is expected to total \$6.618 billion, second only to 1973 and \$600 million above 1975 figures. The Lone Star State should reach the No. 1 spot by the target date, assuming the normal rate of growth for the state, currently leading Texas.

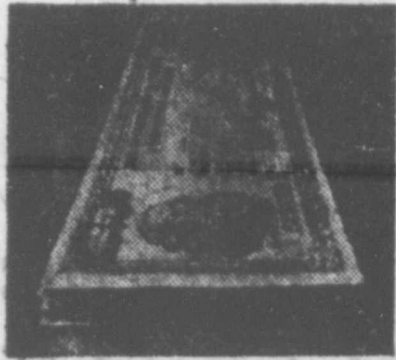


