In the second game, a real test, Hedley won from Sabes 59 to 55. Mike Darnell had 19, John Lemley 14, Stuart Messer and John Lemley 7 each, Bob White 6, Randy Woodard 4 and Jeff Hill 2.

In the finale the Owls defeated Jayton 73 to 59. Mike Darnell had 25, Stuart Messer 24, Joe Lemley 11, John Lemley 9, Randy Woodard and Bob White 2 each.

Texas On Way To No. 1 In Agriculture

Texas is making steady progress toward becoming the leading state in agricultural income, says the director of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. A special campaign, "On Our Way to No. 1," was launched by the Extension Service in 1974. The target date is 1980 and the goal is \$8.436 billion. Agricultural income for 1976 is expected to total \$6.618 billion, second only to 1973 and \$600 million above 1975 figures. The Lone Star State should reach the No. 1 spot by the target date, assuming the normal rate of growth for the states currently leading Texas.

PLAN AHEAD

Sort clothes according to type of fabric, color-fastness, degree of soil and garment construction. You'll save both hot water and electricity by doing similar items together. Accumulate a full load before running your washer.



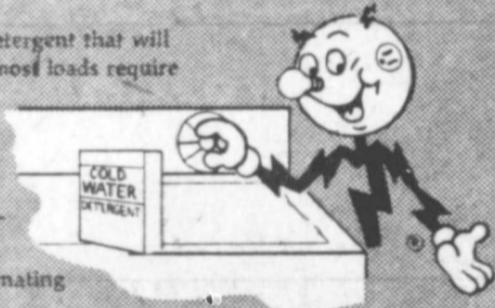
BE SELECTIVE

Choose the cycle that is precisely appropriate for the clothes you are washing. Is a "hot" temperature setting really necessary? Except for heavily soiled items, most loads will come clean in either a cold or warm wash. Look into cold wash detergents.

Use the least amount of detergent that will get your clothes clean—most loads require only an ounce or less!

Overloading causes extra strain and wear on your equipment; check the manufacturer's recommendations for load weight.

Balance your load by alternating small and large items.



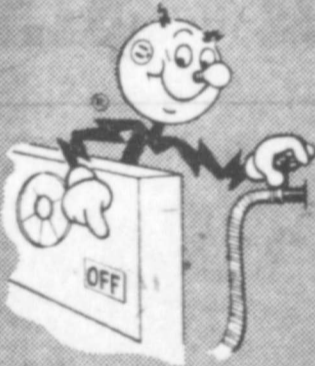
FOR SAFETY SAKE

Be sure control is "off" before reaching into your washer.

If one is necessary, use only a heavy duty extension cord.

Be sure your washer is grounded.

Keep dry cleaning agents, color remover and Fiberglas out of your washer. It's a good idea not to wash clothes containing cleaning fluids in your washer.

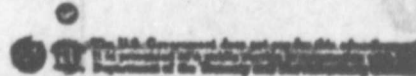
