Farm and Ranch Accident Study

A Texas Farm and Ranch Accident Study has been initiated to obtain the best possible information on the nature and extent of farm and ranch accidents. The goal is to use this information to develop safety education programs to halt the mounting accidents that claim more than 200 lives and cause more than 4,000 disabling injuries in the state each year, says an agricultural safety engineer with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. The study will involve 42 counties, with some 7,000 farm and ranch families being interviewed by about 700 neighbor volunteers.

Texas On Way To No. 1 In Agriculture

Texas is making steady progress toward becoming the leading state in agricultural income, says the director of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. A special campaign, "On Our Way to No. 1," was launched by the Extension Service in 1974. The target date is 1980 and the goal is \$8.436 billion. Agricultural income for 1976 is expected to total \$6.618 billion, second only to 1973 and \$600 million above 1975 figures. The Lone Star State should reach the No. 1 spot by the target date, assuming the normal rate of growth for the state currently leading Texas.

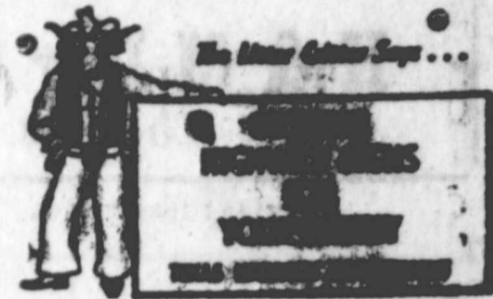

Breakeven Costs Key To Profits

Texas farmers need to take a close look at breakeven costs in planning for optimum crop profits says an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Breakeven costs for variable expenses vary with specific regions but average 28 cents a pound for cotton, \$2.21 per 100 pounds of sorghum, \$1.88 per bushel of wheat and \$1.62 per bushel of corn. Total production costs average 47 cents for cotton, \$3.89 for sorghum, \$3.37 for wheat and \$2.62 for corn. By comparing income above variable costs per acre for each crop, a producer can select a combination of crops for optimum income.
