



Texas farmers need to take a close look at breaksven costs in plambibg for optimum crop profits says an economist with the Texas Agriculturel Extension Service. Breakeven costs for variable bat penses vary with specific regions but average 28 certs a pound for Cotton, \$2 21 per 100 pounds of sorghum, \$1.88 per bushel of boys did not place in the top tebl wheat and \$1.62 per bushel of The Quail team was composed of corb.
