### Breakeven Costs Key To Profits

Texas farmers need to take a close look at breakeven costs in plaining for optimum crop profits says an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Breakeven costs for variable happenses vary with specific regions but average 28 certs a pound for cotton, \$2 21 per 100 pounds of sorghum, \$1 88 per bushel of wheat and \$1 62 per bushel of cotton. Total production costs average 47 cents for cotton, \$3 89

for sorghum, \$3 37 for wheat and \$2 62 for corp By comparing income above variable costs per acre for each crop, a producer can select a combination of crops for optimum income.
