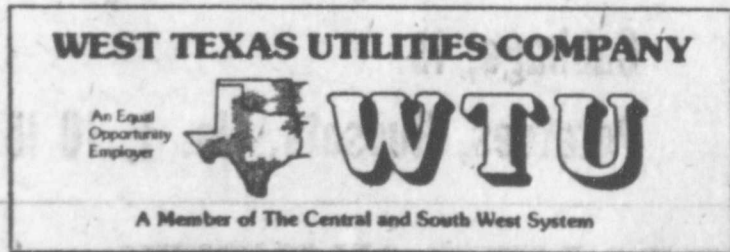

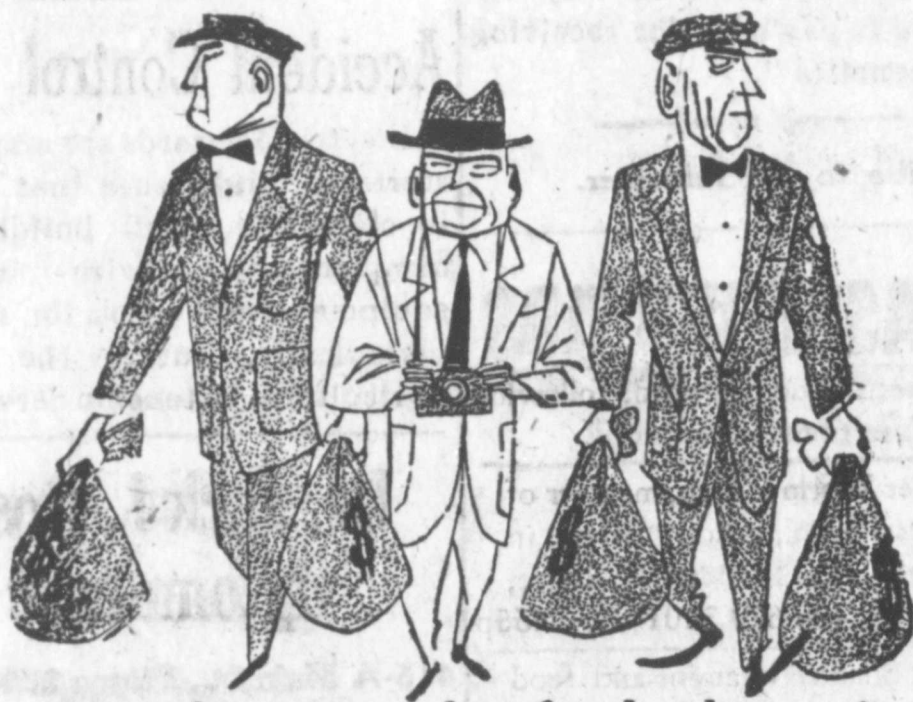

"Those who are on SSI are in no way obligated to pay a fee for receiving these benefits."
