Imports of foreign meat during the first six months of 1977 fell considerably below a year ago—down 81 million pounds or 12 percent, notes a livestock marketing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Beef and veal imports were down 14 percent, lamb imports were off 28 percent, and pork imports were down 4 percent. Imports of live cattle increased 12 percent during the same six month period while sheep imports fell 82
