Beef Short Course Offered Feb. 13-16

A beef production short course for adult farmers will be held Feb. 13 through 16 under the sponsorship of the Hedley High School Ag. Dept., according to Supt. Vernon Scott and Ag. teacher Doyle Messer.

Dr. Richard C. Thomas, beef production specialist with the Voc. Ag. Division of the Texas Education Agency and the Dept. of Animal Science at Texas A&M, will be the instructor. He is headquartered at Texas A&M.

Dr. Thomas has a strong background in animal production and genetics. He received his BS and MS degrees from Texas A&M and his Ph.D. from Iowa State. For the past seven years he was in charge of the beef cattle research at the Experiment Station at McGehee. He directly supervised the nutrition, health, and reproduction programs used there.

The short course is to begin Feb. 13 at 7 p.m. in the Hedley Lions Den. Other meetings in the series of four will be Feb. 14, 15 and 16. During the dates the short course is in progress, Dr. Thomas will be available to assist farmers with individual problems and to provide on-the-farm instruction, according to Doyle Messer.

Cattlemen interested in attending the short course should write to staff Mr. Scott or Mr. Messer. An entry fee of \$5 will be charged.

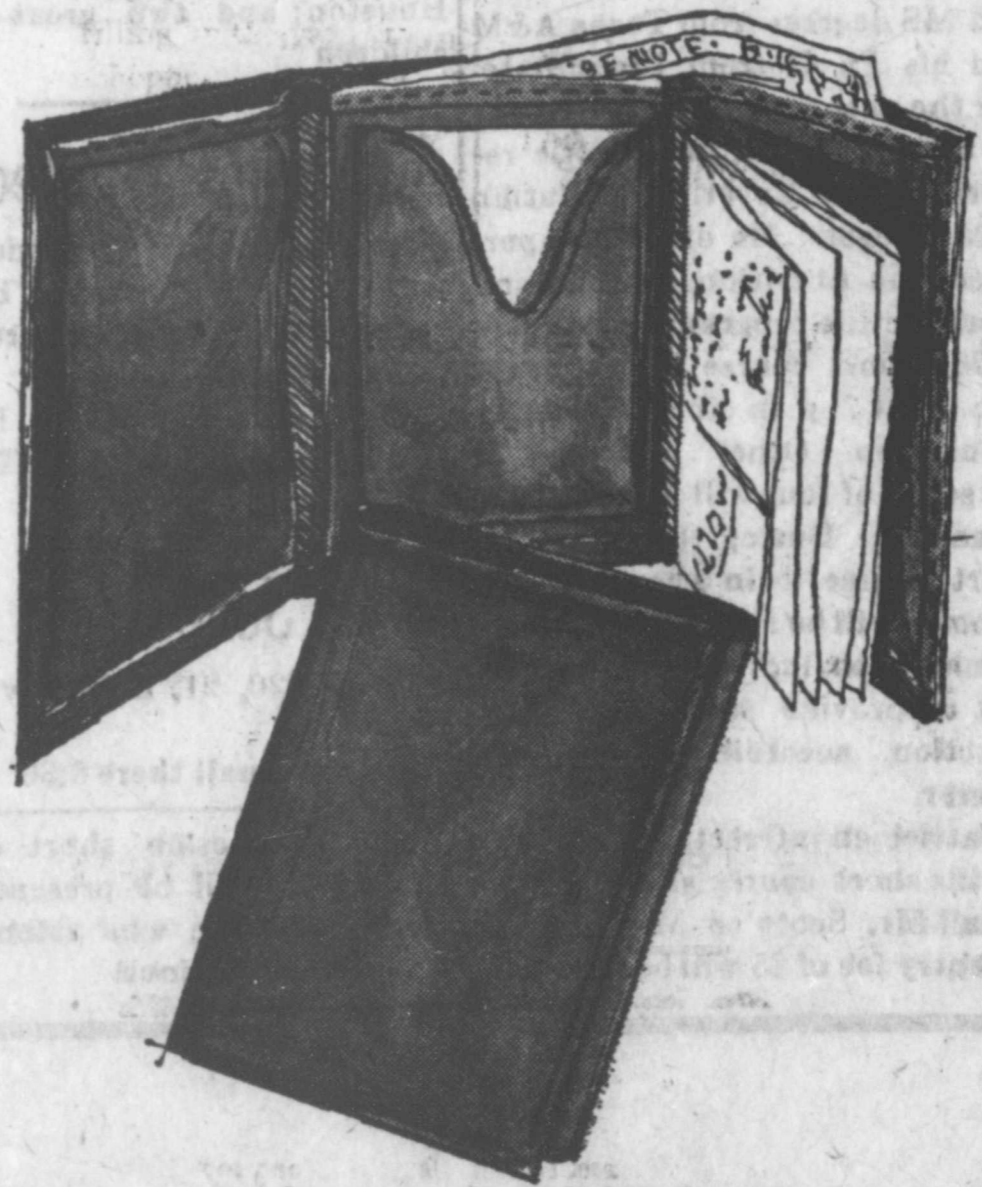
