Joint School and City Election

The school and city will have a joint election on April 1.

There will be two trustees to elect for the school. Trustees whose terms are expiring are Don Spriggs and T. E. Naylor.

There will be a mayor and three aldermen to elect for the city. Aldermen whose terms are expiring are J. S. Hibbs, Henry Moore and Bill Waddell. Since Mr. Hibbs is running for county judge, he will not be a candidate this time. Mayor Ed Boliver is not running for re-election.

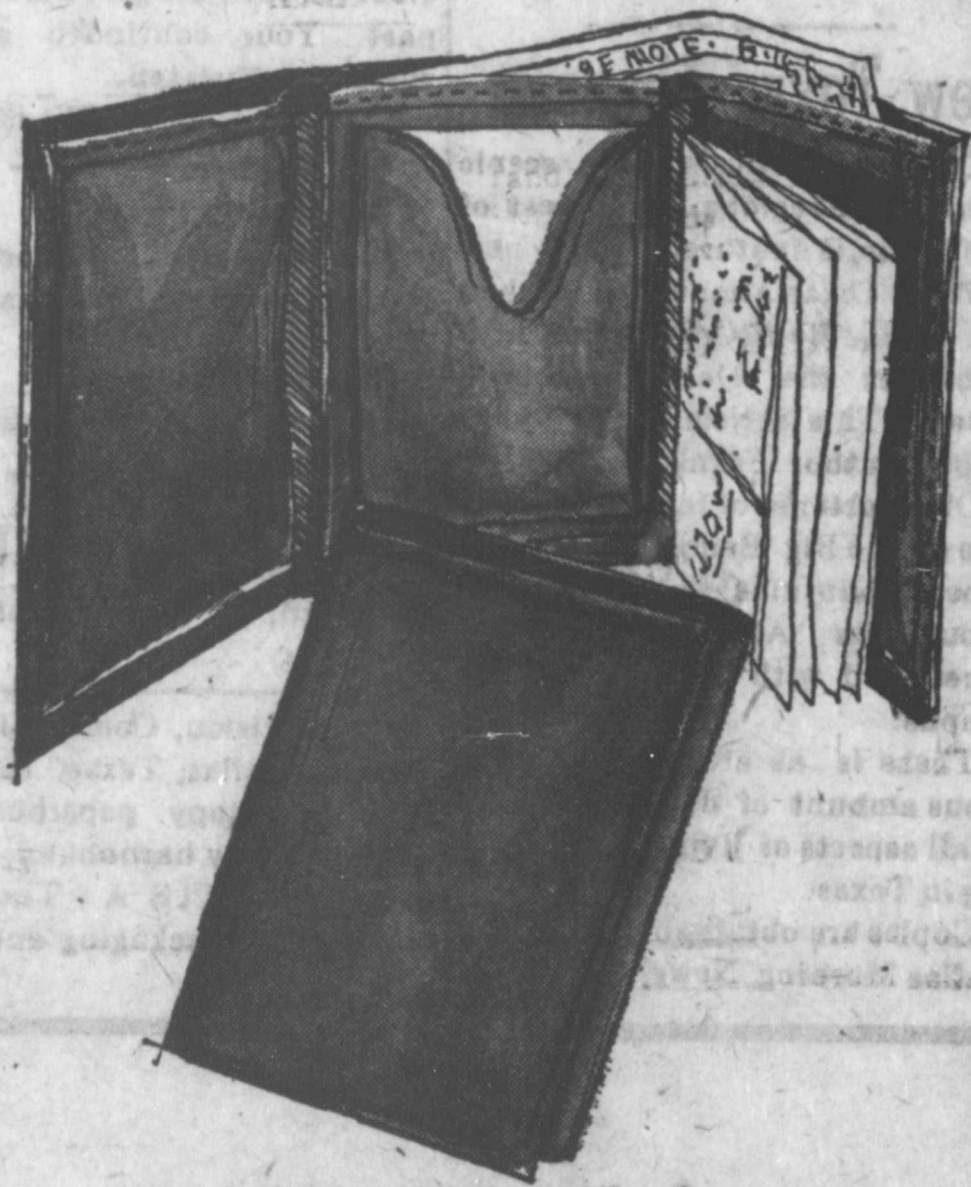
