Biography Issued Of Cal C. Wright

"With God in the Light," a biography of one of the major figures in Northwest Texas Methodism, the late Cal C. Wright, was published June 1, by McMurry College Books.

The life of "Brother Cal" was written by Dr. Joseph D. Stamey, chairman of the McMurry College philosophy department. The 164 page volume contains both illustrations by artist Shari Burns and photographs.

Wright served as pastor of the Hedley United Methodist Church from 1917 to 1920.

The hardback edition of this biography will sell for \$9.50 after publication date. The paperback edition will sell for \$4.75.

WTU Opposes Innovative Rates

West Texas Utilities Co. has urged the Public Utility Commission of Texas not to adopt innovative utility rate structures or new electric use management controls until it is proven conclusively that benefits outweigh costs and that the customer will readily accept the changes.

WTU opposes widespread time-of-day pricing, mechanical load management techniques, and life line rates.

Steady Cotton Market

Although the U. S. cotton crop will be much smaller this year than last, prices are expected to show little improvement, according to a marketing economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. World cotton supplies remain large, as is U. S. cotton in public storage. While exports are strong, domestic mill use remains weak. And the competition between man-made fibers and cotton remains intense.

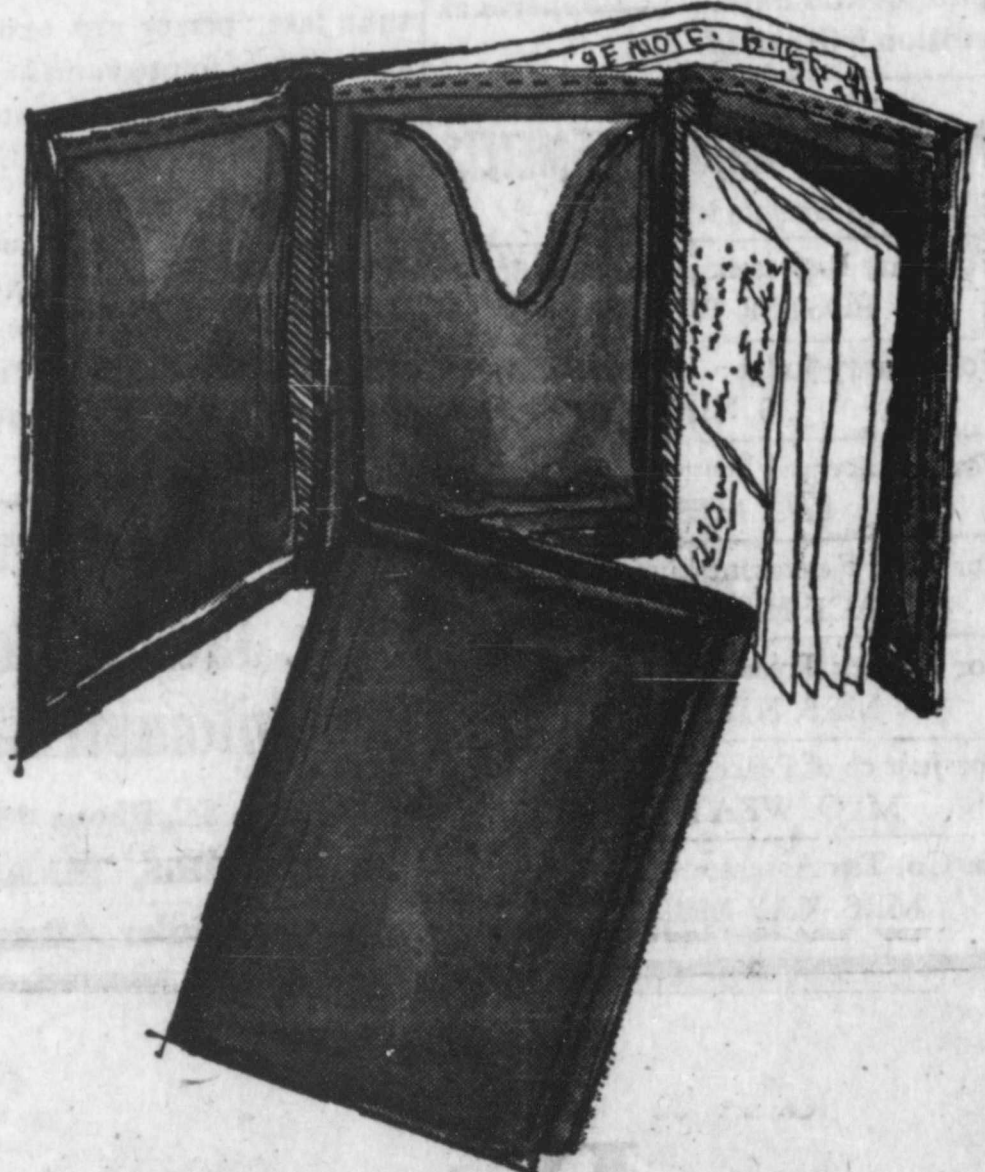

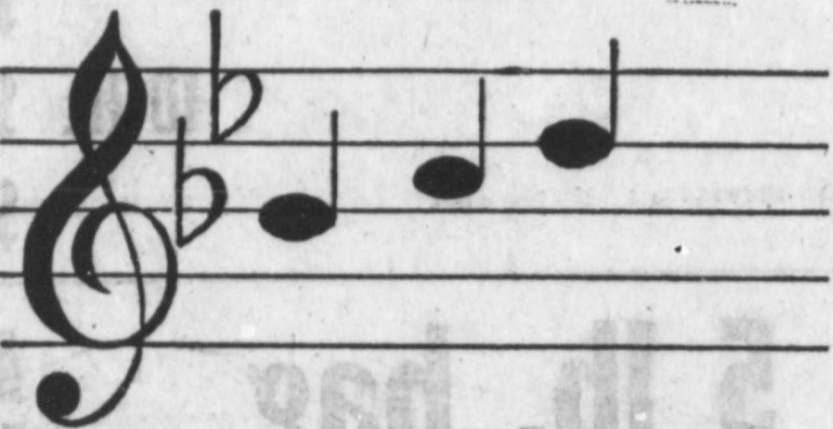
