Biography Issued Of Cal C. Wright

"With God in the Light," a biography of one of the major figures in Northwest Texas Methodism, the late Cal C. Wright, was published June 1, by McMurry College Books.

The life of "Brother Cal" was written by Dr. Joseph D. Stamey, chairman of the McMurry College philosophy department. The 164 page volume contains both illustrations by artist Shari Burns and photographs.

Wright served as pastor of the Hedley United Methodist Church from 1917 to 1920.

The hardback edition of this biography will sell for \$9.50 after publication date. The paperback edition will sell for \$4.75.
