

Winter Pastures Increasing

More and more Texas farmers and ranchers are planting winter pastures, says a forage specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. The main reasons are that hay supplies are short due to the drought and that winter pastures can provide high quality grazing during the winter and early spring. Planting wheat, oats or ryegrass on a prepared seedbed is best although they can also be seeded into bermudagrass sod.

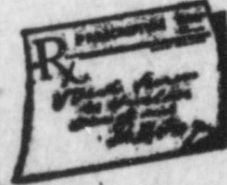
