The shortage in the cattle supply at the principal western markets thus far this year amounts to nearly 270,000 head compared with a year ago. The shortage in poundof dressed beef since the first of the year figures out about 173,-000,000 pounds, or nearly 2,000,000 a day. At the same time the price of live cattle has advanced about 2 cents a pound.

The following recipe for euring scab on sheep by the use of lime and sulphur was given the DEVIL's RIVER NEWs this week by a sheep man who has no trouble keeping his flocks clean:

To dip 1000 head of freshly shorn sheep take 80 pounds of sulphur, 40 pounds of lime and 60 gallons of water, boil slowly for three and a half hours. Put one gallon of this mixture to 10 gallons of water. Let sheep remain in vat three minutes.


