POLISHING FURNITURE. How to See "Your Lice Reflected" In the

Shining Tables. It is a most satisfactory state of affairs and an evidence of careful and dainty house ifery if when entering the room it is evidenced that the chairs, tables, cabinets and other polished furnitvre surfaces reflect the light, glistening as with much careful rubbing and showing absence of dust and grime.

There is no one of the housekeeper's duties that rejuires more care-ful attention that the care of furnituro surfaces. Dust will settle, dampness and sterm moisten it, and though a room my be carefully put

to rights every lay some dust is bound to adhere especially in corners and the crevicos of carvings and crnato work, that, if neglected, presents anything but a lovely appearance. If ther are children, the






