BRINGING IN THE YULE LOG.



But always the Yule log is brought home in triumph. If it is small, it is carried on the shoulder of the father or the eldest son; if of a goodly size, these two carry it together, or a young husband and wife may bear it between them-as we actually saw a thick branch of our almond borne away that afternoon-while their children caracole around them or lend little helping hands.

Being come to the Mazet, the log was stood on end in the courtyard in readiness to be taken hence to the fireplace on Christmas eve I fancied that the men handled it with a certain reverence, and the vidame assured me that such actually was the case.
