"Another new feature of the encampment will be the tents. We shall use a tent capable of instant change. It can be used either as the 'A' or the common tent. or for a storm or shelter tent. I shall also insist upon the abandonment of the bayonet and revolver. The bayonet is of no use what ever to-day, as one cannot get close enough to the enemy to use it. I shall replace it with a combination trowel and tent-peg. The new guns is to be carried either by sling across the shoulder or across the pommel. Particular attention will also be given to individual marks-manship. There will be open-order firing, which will prove the utter uselessness of bayonet chages.
