We would like to call the attention of the sheep men of this section to the fact that we now have in operation a ten-machine plant of sheep shearers on the ranch of B. F. Robey, in Coleman county, and would advise that any who are interested in

the improvement of the general shearing system, should go down and inspect the workings of the plant. Where a man has as many as 4000 to 5000 head of sheep, either of his own or that are obtainable for shearing, he can not afford to be without the machine. This machine will shear any class of sheep and do it better than can be done with any hand crew. When the machine is properly handled there are on second cut of the fleece, and fleeces are unbroken. The extra weal that is cut from the hide, that would otherwise be left on the sheep, not only adds to the weight of the clip but also longthens the stap's and therefore demands for the owner a better price. Sheep cannot be out only by extreame carelessness, thus decreasing the death rate from cuts and screw worms. Any one can do expert shearing with the machine after but a little practice and sheep are thorn close'y and evenly, presenting an attractive and uniform appearance, thereby improving their condition for market if it is desired to sell them soon after shearing. Enough wool is saved in the
