Believe it or not, the U.S. Congress recognized this problem and has

is known as the QTIP, which stands
for Qualified for Qualified Terminable Interest
Property. The OTIP in terms, allows the landed spouse to
give the receiving spouse outright. The landed spouse gets to designate
who will inherit the land when the receiving spouse dies, but the land
still gets sheltered from estate and still gets sheltered from estate and
inherentance tax by the receiving
spouse's inheritance tax by the receiving
spouse's $\$ 1,350,000$ deduction potential. The life estate entitites the
receiving spouse to receiving spouse to only the income
from the land during that spouse's fifetime. When the receiving spouse dies, the land passes according to the
directions left by the landed spouse directions left by the landed spouse,
even though the land is considered to even though the land is considered to
be in the receiving spouse's estate fo estate tax purposes.
