Unemployment Disaster Discussed

State Representative Dudley
Harrison (D.Sanderson), along with State Senator Bill Sims (D-San
Angelo), passed S.B 23 today during the 7 1st Legislature's, record 6 th Special Session. S.B. 23 , relating to
an employer's chargeback liability for unemployment compensation
benefits based on separations from enmplyment caused by certain natural
disasters, will protect the and disasters, will protect the accounts of
employers from charges for unemployment compensation if the area is
declared a disaster area by the declared a disaster area by the
President of the United Sates under President of the
the Stafford Act.

Under current law, employers are
being doubly penalized, once by the disaster itself, and next next by having
benefits paid char ers unemployment insurance. In other words, if a displaced worker
applies for the Disaster applies for the Disaster Unemploy-
ment Assistance (DUA) ment Assistance (DUA) after a
natural disaster but is eligible for
regular unemployment benefits, they regular unemployment benefits, they
will receive the regular benefits instead of the DUA. This causes the

## Liability Insurance-The Law

| If you happen tofbe involved in an automobile accident in Texas today, your chances are one in four that the collision will invlolve an uninsured motorist. In some areas of the state, the likelihood is much higher, with approximately seven out of ten motorists driving without insurance. Last year, there were more than 125,000 uninsured drivers involved in automovile accidents in Texas, according to the Texas Department of Public Safety. This caused thousands of individuals and families great financial and emotional stress. Moreover, the high percentage of uninsur- ed motorists contributed to higher overall insurance premiums for insured motorists, since it raises the amount that insured drivers pay for the uninsured motorists' coverage in their policies. <br> The situation was about the same in 1981, when the Legislature passed the Compulsor Auto Insurance Financial Responsibility Law in Texas. Before the law was passed, 26 percent of Texas motorists were uninsured. In the initial months following the law's sured motorists dropped significantly, with some areas of the state achieving 90 percentcompliance. Eight years later, however, we're back to where we were before. Why? Partly because alotof people are not aware of what the law is today, either because they are new residents of Texas, or because they are young and notorists may be unable to afford the coverage, may unknowingly let their insrance policies lapse, or may choose for a variety of reasons to disregard the law. | To call attention to this matter, the Office of Consumer Protection has launched a statewide campaign to raise public awareness of the automobile liability law in Texas. The summer-long campaign has received the backing of the editorial boards of several of the largest newspapers in Texas. In addition, Gov. Bill Clements and the mayors of 10 of the largest cities in the state issued proclamations in support of this effort. In the weeks and monins ahead, you will be seeing a new television public service announcement featuring the campaign slogan, "Liability: the Law of the Road." A series of radio PSAs will be a part of this educational effort. <br> As a driver in Texas, you are required by law to carry minimum liability insurance in the following amounts: $\$ 20,000$ for the bodily injury or death of one person; $\$ 40,000$ for the bodily injury of death of two or more individuals per occurrence; and $\$ 15,000$ for damage to the property of others. A first violation of the law is punishable by a fine of $\$ 75$ plus court costs, and subsequent violations are punishable by fines $\$ 200$ plus court costs, as will as the possible suspension of the driver's license. <br> We know that no compulsory law ( can quarantee 100 percent compli भo -ance. But several states have been ve successful at increasing compliance through close monitoring and/or tougher laws. In North Carolina, for example, strict monitoring of compliance has resulted in a consistent uninsured motorists rate of 3 percent, the lowest in the country. In Hawaii, uninsured drivers are facing stiff new penalties, although the jury | is still out as to their long-term effects. The initial penalty in that state for driving without insurance is now $\$ 1,000$, with subsequent offenses punishable by fines of at least $\$ 3,000$. <br> Last year, several bills were miroduced in the Texas Legislature making it tougher on uninsured motorists to disregard the law, but none were enacted into law. The adequacy of the Compulsory Auto Insurance/Financial Responsibility Law is something that legislators will likely grapple with in succeeding sessions. Regardless of what happens, however, the uninsured motor- <br> Texas Faces B <br> UVALDE, Texas- 1990 may go down as the Year of the Bug in Southwest Texas. <br> Drought conditions for the past several years has led to some interesting insect outbreaks, says Dr. J.W. | I have addressed issues these past few weeks dealing with landscape maintenance and planning. I often get questions from persons new to the area on what plants are adapted to our area. here are a few answers to some of the more common questions generally asked. <br> Question: "What is a good, fast-growing shade tree for our Answer: These terms do not necessarily go hand in hand. Fast growth is a bad trait to select a shade tree for. In general, fast-growing trees are weak-wooded. They are subject to insect and disease invasion and usually short-lived. Moderate grow- | ing trees like a variety of oaks, pecans, and elms grow almost as fast but live decades or even centuries longer. <br> Question: "What are some good shrubs for a foundation planting?" -Answer: The old practice of planting a hedgerow of dense evergreen shrubs such as juniper or waxleaf ligustrum has evolved into a more modern approach of clusters or groups of plants. The theory was to conceal a foundation that was high or other structure formations around the house. I think everyone would rather have a more natural look with rounded clusters of plants rather than a hedgerow effect. Use odd |

tion for shrubs than for trees. Trees, at maturity, are much larger than
shrubs and roots will entually grow out of the surrounding soils. That is why it is inmportant to choose trees that are adapted to this area. Shrubs, on the other hand, are more
contained and some preparation is contained and some preparation is
mecessary to their planting beds.
Mix in lots of organic matter sure competition from weeds is
controlled.

Black Bears sighted in Trans-Pecos ALPINE-Sighting of black bears
have increased during the past three years in the rugged Trans-Pecos
region of West Texas, according to participants in a recent workshop on the species. Texas Parks ment (TPWD) said the Departbilled as the "First Texas Black Bear Workshop," was organized to exchange information among the concerning conservation and man agement of the bears which are listed as endangered in Texas.
Attending the meeting were repre-
sentatives of the TPWD Sentatives of the TPWD, Sul Ross the National Park Service, the Big Bend Natural History Association,
Texas A\&M Extension Service and private research organizations. er, said increased sightings in th Trans-Pecos probably resulted from
recent increases in the reproductive rates of black bears in Northern Mexico. "The Lower Trans-Pecos is a natural corridor for these bears to ably seeing a spill-over effect from Mexican bear populations," she said. Frequency of sightings has increased during the past three years on the
department's Black Gap Wildlife Management Area in Brewster County and also at Big Bend
National Park to the west. Billie P McKinney, a wildife technician the Black Gap, said bears have been observed frequently there since 1980, and the animals have been regular inhabitants since 1985. He estimated
that there are presently about three bears on the area.
Rick LoBello of the Big Bend Neatural History Association said
bear shtings by Big Bend park personnel and visitors have increased from an average of less than three per year during 1980-87, to 21 sightings A research paper presented by Dr.
Eric Hellgren of Texas A\&l discussed he potential problems and benefits of black bears. "Benefits would be
