Hot, dry weather such as we are currently experiencing is a factor that seems to stimulate rabies outbreaks population and spill over into domestic animals and pets exposed to bites or scratches from the infected
animal animal, often the injuries being
undetected by the owners undetected by the owners until it's
too late. Never, ever should the owners of pets that have been vaccinated against rabies assume thal
the vaccination will pro the vaccination will protect their pet
from contracting rabies if bitten by from contracting rabies if bitten by
an infected animal. The pet that does antain a bite or injury from an
obtan
unknown source should be isolated unknown source should be isolated
for at least 14 days ( 21 to 45 days is for at least 14 days ( 21 to 45 days is
even better). On May 27, 1990 a Ft. Clark resident reported that his dog had
been bitten by a skunk and though the dog had been vaccinated against rabies, further investigation was needed. The skunk was luckily
identified, located, and killed with the head sent to Austin for examinat-
ion. The dog was placed in isolation for observation for 45 days. The
skunk has been determined to have had rabies at the time the dog was
bitten and all Kinney County residents, and most especially those with
livestock and family pets should take precautions against the dreaded
disease disease All family pets (cats, dogs, and
other mammals) should be vaccin-
ated against rabies annually and ated against rabies annually and
anyone observing a wild animal that
appears unusually tame appears unusualy tame or sict
Should immediately get away from
that animal and report it to the Sheriff's Department. Anyone who
has cats or dogs or other pet has cats or dogs or other pet
mammals that run loose and appear
to have been bitten or scratched and to have been bitten or scratched and
the source is unknown should immediately isolate that animal for at
least 14 to 21 days. And least 14 to 21 days. And, most
importantly, anyone bitten or scratched by a dog or cat or a wild
animal should immeditely animal should immediately report the
incident and attempt to have the guilty animal identified, isolated,
and/or killed and it's head sent off for examination.

just plain old common sense and basic rules of caustion and ,pre-
caution will provide adequate protection against the dreaded disease of

poisoning. Food poisoning is more and unless it rains all day, it's bound to be hot on July 4 in Texas. Here are Department of Agriculture home

and the like. You'll need plenty o
ice Pre-chilled beverage bottles will ice. Pre-chilled beverage bottles will
also help keep food also help keep food cold. Wrap food
containers tightly, and put raw
perishables into plastic bags. Make sure the cooler lid closes tightly. At
the picnic site keep the cooler in the the picnic site keep the cooler in the
shade.
5. If you're grilling meat or poultry 4. If you're grilling meat or poultry,
be sure to cook it thoroughly to destroy any organisms that might
cause illness. 5. Don't let cooked food sit around 5. long. Bacteria grow between 40 and 140 degrees F . When foods are these temperatures, bacteria grow rapidly. Milk products, eggs and
seafood should remain on ice until you're ready to use them. Surprise. The U.S. Department of
Agriculture says that, contrary what most people think, mayonaise
does not increase the risk does not increase the risk of food
poisoning. Most commercial mayonaises and salad dressings contain lemon juice or other acid flavoring,
which slows bacterial which slows bacterial growth. Salt in
mayonaise also retards bacterial mayonaise also retards bacterial
growth. A little mayonaise in food, therefore, actually decreasess chances
for food poisoning slightly, says for food poisoning slightly, says
USDA. That's no excuese, however, USDA. That's no excuese, however,
to leave dishes containing mayonaise out in the heat. The best
thumb--keep them on ice.
