## Record-Breaking Week For Lottery In Texas

Parmer County contributed to $\$ 17.9$ million sold during the first the record-breaking first week of the Texas released this week by State Comptroller John Sharp. Parmer County accounted for
approximately $\$ 51,000$ in lottery sales during the first week, tying the county for eighth among the 32 counties in the Texas Panhandle. $\$ 102.4$ million in lottery tickets $\$ 102.4$ million in lottery tickets
during its first week, Sharp reported. His office oversees the game.
Accor According to lottery officials,
that amounts to $\$ 5.94$ in tickets for that amounts to $\$ 5.94$ in tickets for every man, woman and child in the
state, and breaks the $\$ 95$ million record set by the Florida lottery in
Figures distributed by lottery headquarters showed that about
$\$ 912,000$ worth of tickets were sold in Potter County between 6 a.m.
May 29 and 6 a.m. June 5 . Another $\$ 318,000$ in tickets were sold in Randall County.
The sales ranged down to a low $\$ 500$ in Motley County $\$ 500$ in Motley County, among the 32 Parmer County's
doubt helped by out-of-state purchasers. Swisher and Floyd counties, about the same population-wise, but farther from the state line, reported just $\$ 20,000$
in sales apiece. Hale County, with populous Plainview as its hub, listed its sales at $\$ 61,000$-just $\$ 10,000$ more than Parmer's total. In Bovina, Allsup's reported that they sold approximately 12,000

averaged paying out about $\$ 400$ per

ebrate her birthday by granting her wish "to hold Billy Dixon's Medal of Honor just one more time." Brenda Haes, Registrar for the PPHM, recently learned from Sgt. Steve O'Keefe at the Army Awards Branch in Washington, D.C. that
Mrs. Irwin had expressed this desire Mrs. Irwin had expressed this desire History buffs who have studied the accounts of the Texas Panhandle Indian wars of the 1870s will remember the name of Billy Dixon. Recognized by his peers as a
"sharpshooter" Dixon is credited "sharpshooter Dixon is credited
with the famous long shot fired just as the 1874 Battle of Adobe Walls (an early Texas Panhandle trading post) had subsided. The bullet
struck an Indian at a distance of approximately seven-eighths of a mile. Later, Dixon and a few others
held off a band of Indians for several days at the Battle of Buffalo
Wallow, for which the Medal of Hich he was awarded Mrs. Olive Dixon (wife of
Billy Dixon) donated the medal on June 7, 1921 to the PanhandlePlains Historical Society. At that time, Mrs. Dixon also gave the
Society the 1873 U.S. Springfield Rifle used by Billy Dixon at Adobe Although Dixon died when Mrs. Irwin was only nine years old
she clearly remembers him as a wonderful man who loved animals. Mrs. Irwin is the fourth of Dixon's seven children. Mrs. Irwin and her husband,
Water R. Irwin, have three children: Mrs. John Maynard of
Amarillo, Mrs. James L. Hayes of Garden Grove, California, and W. K. Irwin of Bushland.
