Link this to the fact that over twelve hundred miles of the Rio Grande River is International Border, you can understand why this subject is intertwined with the history of Texas.

When Texas declared its independence in 1836. The Rio Grande River was designated as its southern and western boundary. Mexico recognized the Rio Grande as boundary in 1848 with the Guadalupe-Hidalgo Treaty.

Using a river as a boundary seems a natural way to divide territory. However, the problems that can arise are endless. Rivers never settle down to flow in one straight line; they consistently move with time.

Flooding can devastate property and endanger lives, and when efforts are made to control flooding by building dams, property rights on both sides of the river are involved. When this involves two different countries, the possibilities for dispute are serious indeed. Who owns the water that is captured? Who gets how much of the water that is



This disastrous occurrence inspired the people in the flooded areas to pressure for the continuation of the flood control project. Several sites were studied and the confluence of the Devil's River and Rio Grande was chosen since this would catch floodwaters from those rivers as well as the Pecos. President Kennedy never came to Del Rio, but he met with the Mexican president several times in El Paso concerning the dam and encouraged better relations with Mexico before his assassination. Presidents Eisenhower, Johnson, and Nixon visited Del Rio along with Mexican Presidents Lopez Mateos and Diaz Ordaz while work was in progress. Both President Ordaz Continued on Page 5
