Mandell, who now considers himself a young senior citizen, discovered he was diabetic at the age of 40. A dedicated athlete he had ran marathons, was a triathlete and black belt in karate yet still tested positive for the disease.

As he found out in the years immediately after being diagnosed, his was not an unusual story. One of the scariest aspects of diabetes is that, without knowledge of the warning signs of diabetes and without getting tested it can go unnoticed, undetected for years. 




