> The detention center will be on 60 acres of land, located on Highway 131, approximately 1.3 miles south of the Highway 90 intersection.

> Construction is expected to begin soon. Once it is underway, officials expect the facility to be completed in 12 to 14 months.


Community Council offers forum at FCS

For some reason, that sounds extremely gross to me, but hey, what do I know?


