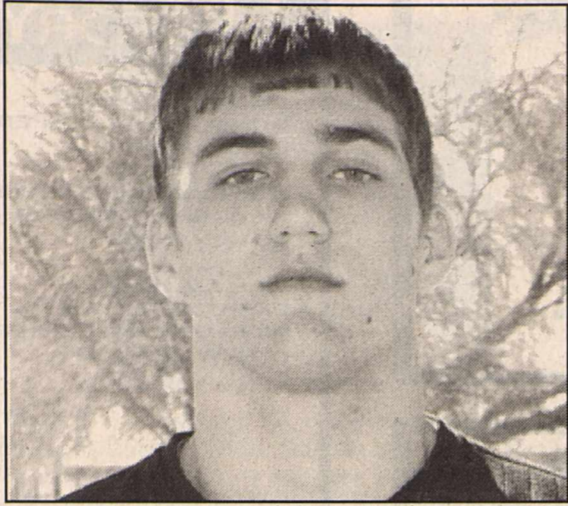

1600 M relay team; Smith, Cheyenne Billings, Braesicke, and Nash, placed 3rd with a time of 4:32.0.

Individually for the 3200 M; Courtney Kirkland placed 4th with a time of 13:27, Brianna Escamilla placed 5th with a time of 13:42 and Haley Hale placed 6th with a time of 13:51.

Bianca Cruz placed 6th in the 800 M with a time of 2:44.

Smith placed 1st in the 100 M with a time of 13.7 and Hernandez came in 2nd with 14.2 as her time.

The Tigers finished the season with a 12-15 record overall and a 5-5 district record.

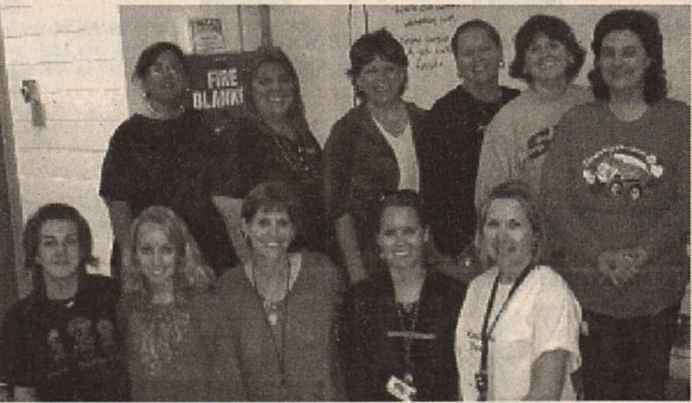

Science is Alive and Jumping at Jones Elementary

Funded by the Teacher Educator Excellence Grant, twelve Jones Elementary faculty members are currently sponsoring a 1-hour weekly science laboratory session for approximately 25 at-risk students in grades 4-6. Students will spend the semester exploring food webs and ecosystems through hands-on exploration, including plant experiments and observations of live animals. Most recently, students and teachers observed the American Chameleon, or Anole, in a terrarium environment shared by crickets, earthworms, and a groundcover of rye grass. By the end of the term, students will have constructed a complete, self-sustaining ecosystem within their terrariums. All lab activities address vital state learning objectives (TEKS) to help these at-risk students prepare for the science TAKS in the 5th and 8th grades.

This figure may not mean that you, but if you are victim - a few hundred dollars, it is an upsetting and expensive cost. That's why you'll want to protect yourself against identity theft. The best time to take action is before you are victimized. Here are a few suggestions:

- Shred credit cards and bank statements. If you are going to apply for a credit card, fill out yours to anyone who asks for it. In fact, as a general rule, don't give it out to anyone who asks for it.
- Study your credit card statements carefully. If you don't recognize any credit card activity, call the credit card company immediately.
- Don't give out your credit card number unless you're initiating a purchase.
- Don't use your credit card at an ATM.
- Don't use your credit card at a gas station.
- Don't use your credit card at a restaurant.
- Don't use your credit card at a store that doesn't have a security camera.

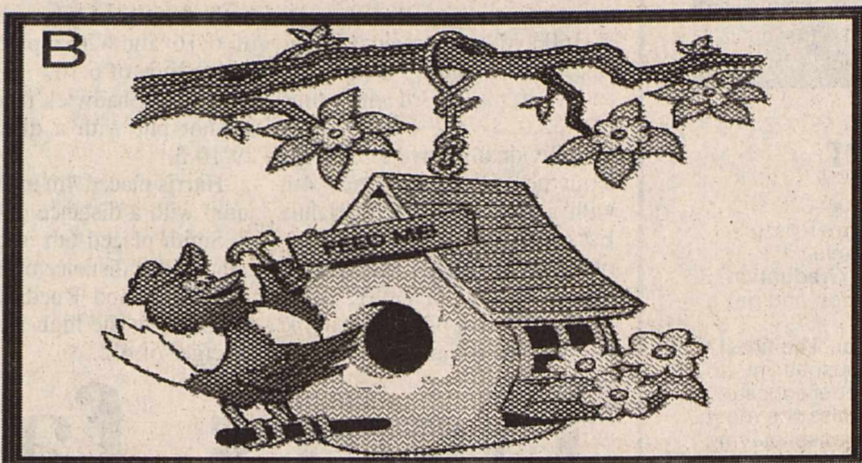
