County employees discontent with 2% COLA raise

Kinney County Commissioner's voted to give all county employees and elected officials a two percent pay raise in the 2008-2009 budget year, but employees scoffed at the amount and submitted a letter to the court requesting more.

A memorandum dated August 6 and signed by more than twenty county employees stated, "We all have and will continue to serve and represent Kinney County and its citizens with integrity and diligence. However, all we are asking for is some relief due to the overall economy increase that we all have been affected by."

In the memo, the employees requested an overall nine percent raise and at a Special Meeting on August 8 Sheriff LK Buddy Burgess, speaking on behalf of his employees and not for himself said his average employee would only make one more dollar per day and that \$30 would not even get them out of the gas station. Burgess went on to say the county employees took pay decreases in the nineties when the county fell on hard times and needed help and now it is time for the county to help the employees. Burgess suggested the commissioners use the 1.3 million dollars it has in reserve to pay for the requested increases.

The commissioners compromised by stating they would consider a four percent raise for county employees only, excluding elected officials, at the budget hearings scheduled for September.

Kinney County Judge Johnny Fritter also settled a pay grievance he filed on August 1. Fritter's salary was reduced by \$10,000 for the 2008-2009 budget year citing the money will be

used to pay a visiting judge when Fritter, suffering from a long-term illness, is unable to hold county court.

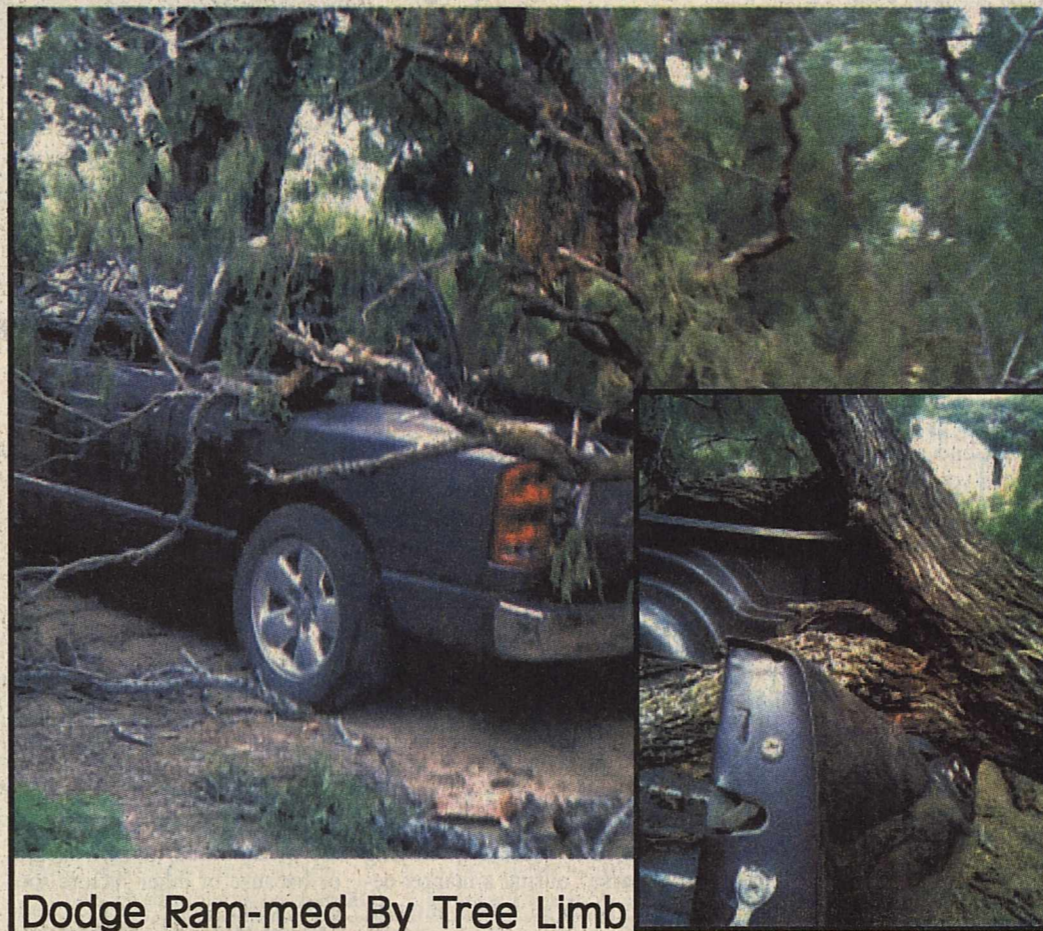
The grievance committee formed in accordance with county policy consisted of five elected officials and four county citizens. Sheriff LK Buddy Burgess, County Clerk Dora Sandoval, Tax Assessor-Collector Martha Padron, County Attorney Tully Shahan, County

Treasurer Janice Floyd and citizens Mary Dorrell, Judith Pfranger, Mary Baldwin and Gene Slate served on the committee.

After a short, but informative question and answer session, committee members voted by secret ballot and the matter of reinstating the money to Fritter's salary was put down in a 6-3 split vote.

Commissioners in an earlier, but separate budget crunching

move reduced Fritter's pay by another \$4,500. In the past the county judge's pay included \$4,500 for travel expenses (ie: gas, hotel, food for training meetings, etc.), but the Commissioner's will now require Fritter to submit receipts for his expenses and he will be reimbursed accordingly. All other elected county officials are required to follow this same procedure.

Renken to seek legal action against BISD board of trustees

Superintendent Paula Renken disagreed with actions taken by Brackett ISD Board of Trustees at a Special meeting on Tuesday, August 18.

After no recommendations from Renken and upon the recommendation of Jones Elementary/Intermediate Principal Alma Gutierrez, the Board unanimously agreed to hire Margarita Sepulveda for a first grade teaching position and Jennifer Baggett for a second grade teaching position.

Renken disagreed with this decision stating, "I believe that what the board is doing and the elementary principal is illegal and I will pursue legal action with our counsel and TEA."

George Stoney Burks, All Level Assistant Principal, was chosen to temporarily replace Renken, who is expected to leave on September 5. Burks will be an administrator with superintendent duties.

In response to Renken's remarks, Trustee Tony Ashley said, "I also want it noted on the record that the President John Schuster contacted Walsh-Anderson and clarified this particular situation and Walsh Anderson did confer with him and state that in this specific situation as long as the board carried [it] unanimously, it could be done."

Burks and High School Principal Frank Taylor were interviewed for the position. The board agreed that the temporary position should be filled by someone with no intention of applying for Superintendent. Taylor is said to have interest in applying for the job.

Renken's position refers to the Board's policy which states, "The Superintendent has sole authority to make recommendations to the Board regarding the selection of contractual personnel." Renken also mentioned, Schuster explained the situation to the attorneys to include extenuating circumstances.

The board decided to have the Texas Association of School Boards act as the search committee in hiring a Superintendent at a cost of approximately \$5,500 to \$6,000. Trustees agreed this process would be simplest especially with the short time frame the District is working with having school start on Monday.

Those circumstances were not disclosed during the open portion of the meeting.

The District will hold a special meeting on Friday, August 22, discussion will include the new hire contracts of two elementary teachers.

Two local ranchers lose livestock due to leash-less dogs

Separate incidences over the last month have resulted in the loss of livestock for two Kinney County ranchers located near or in the city limits.

amended May 13, 2007, it is "unlawful for the owner of a cat or a dog or the person in possession of a cat or a dog to permit such to injure or to damage the property of any person within the City Limits of Brackettville."

One rancher reported a total of 20 pure boar goats and one calf either injured or killed. At least two of the canines in the pack were reportedly Pit Bulls.

It also states, "No cat or dog in heat, whether licensed or not, shall be allowed to run at-large or upon the premises of one other than the owner."

This recent loss of animals could easily add up to between \$5,000 and \$10,000.

All cats and dogs must be vaccinated annually against Rabies by a licensed veterinarian.

The City of Brackettville has an animal control ordinance to prevent incidences such as this.

We have lots of young girls -from preteens on up - that walk for pleasure and or exercise all throughout the day mostly using the main streets of Brackett and Fort Clark. In a recent experience in my own life, a couple of men driving around in a dark sedan decided to follow and taunt a young person in close relation to me. I find these actions absolutely unacceptable, despicable, disgusting and worthy of punishment the law says my husband and I cannot issue without of course going to jail ourselves. What makes this situation worse is that one of the people *SUSPECTED* of harassing this child is a registered sex offender.

As parents we are mad and scared. My first gut reaction is to go to their house and let them know just how angry I am, but I could get in trouble and who goes to jail? Me. They can drive around, harass children. - let me write it again A GIRL - UNDER THE LEGAL AGE OF CONSENT - A CHILD- and there is very little I can do about it until these men actually do something nasty to a child -my child, your child, any child in this community. So we sit and wait in fear.

We have reported the incidents and have been more than pleased with the response and action taken by the KCSO. They continue to keep us updated and I feel that they are taking this serious and have the best interest of the community's children in mind. No one likes a man (or a woman) that takes advantage of children.

I should not have to put my child on a leash because some guy cannot control his impulses. I see attractive men all day long, but I have yet to follow one of them in my car. When you stopped your car in front of my child, what were you planning to do? What was your next move? Were you going to charm her and ask her for her number or were you planning to stuff her in her in your car and do unspeakable things to her?

I believe that if you have time to ride around all day harassing little girls that you obviously are in need of employment. Here's the number to the Workforce Center in Del Rio: 830-774-4741. Maybe if you had a job, girls your own age would be interested in you and you would not have to chase little girls. Stay away from our children. Give them a chance to grow up. These young girls need every opportunity become women and screw up their own lives and they don't need any help from you.

Get a job.

I swear.

I am so angry and I feel helpless. If I do nothing - a life is in danger and I could have done something, right? If I print my PLOG in the newspaper have I over-reacted? I can only say this... I would do this for any child, anywhere. Parents: Keep your eyes out for your children, especially the younger pre-teen and teen girls that like to walk to the stores for a summertime activity. Check the DPS Sex Offender Registry often. Know who lives here and where they live. Coaches: watch those young girls. Neighbors: Keep your eyes out for the children in this community. This is the one time its okay to be a nosey neighbor.

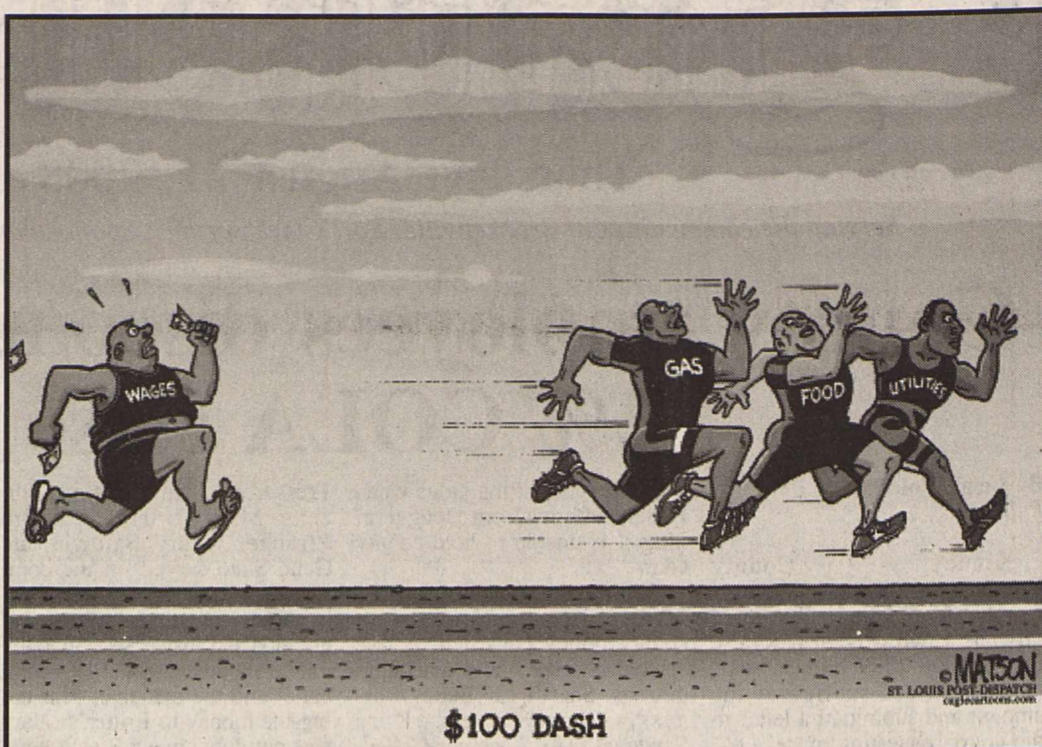

Smart ways to respond to a down market

If you're an investor, you may have been disappointed with how the markets have been reacting this summer to the news of high oil prices and other short-term events. Nonetheless, your long-term financial goals don't have to be jeopardized by these losses — if you know how to respond to them.

Here are a few moves to consider:

- Stick to your investment strategy. It's almost always a bad idea to make long-term investment decisions in response to short-term market fluctuations. If you have built a diversified portfolio of quality investments, you're better off just "staying the course" during a market decline. (Keep in mind, though, that diversification, by itself, cannot guarantee or protect against loss.) If these investments were suitable for you before the market drop, they'll still be appropriate when the market

turns around.

- Don't try to "time" the market. It would be great if you could know when the market had reached its low or high points, or which days would be "losers" and which ones "winners." If you had that foresight, you could always jump in and jump out of the market at the right times. Unfortunately, no one can make those predictions with any accuracy. And those people who do try to "time" the market in this manner end up jumping out at the wrong times and missing both short- and long-term market rallies. By staying invested through market ups and downs, you can make progress toward your long-term goals.

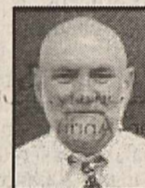
- Look for buying opportunities. By definition, a market decline means that stock prices are lower — which means you may find some good buying opportunities. Of course, you'll want to know if the stock's price is low because of the effects of the broad-based market decline or because of other factors specific to the stock, such as poor management, non-competitive products or a decline in the industry to which it belongs.

While making these moves can help you get past the market decline, it doesn't mean that

a severe price drop can't affect you. If you need money to pay for an unexpected cost, such as a major car repair, you'll likely take a hit if you have to sell stocks when the market has fallen substantially. But you can avoid this problem by putting three to six months worth of living expenses in an emergency fund, preferably in a "cash" or "cash equivalent" account.

Nobody likes to see big declines in the stock market. But if you're a long-term investor, you've built an emergency fund and you've rebalanced your portfolio to fit your risk tolerance, you'll be in a much better position to withstand these market drops — and you'll be well prepared for an eventual recovery.

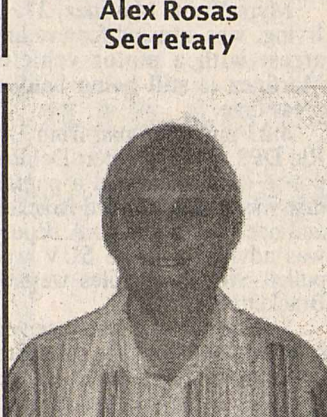

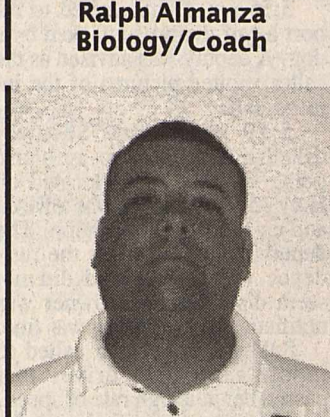

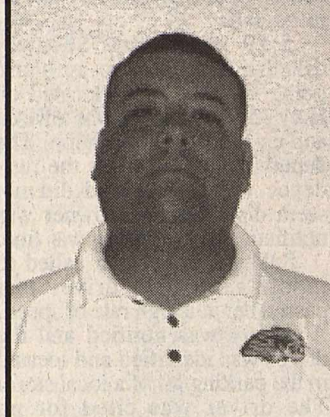

Dear Parent/Guardian:
Children need healthy meals to learn. Brackett Independent School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast is free to everyone; lunch costs \$1.50. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced price is .40 for lunch.

1. Do I need to fill out an application for each child? No. Complete one application to apply for free or reduced meals. Use one Free and Reduced-Price Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to; Honey Bee Gomez, P.O. Box 586, Brackettville, Texas, 78832.

2. Who can get free meals? Children in households getting Food Stamps or TANF can get free meals regardless of your income. Your benefit letter from the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) is your documentation for free meals. If you have not already received a letter from your school stating that your household is eligible for free meals you may take your HHSC benefit letter to your child nutrition office to be certified for free meals. Your children can get free meals if your household income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Guidelines and you must complete this application and submit to your child nutrition office. Head Start students and most foster children can also qualify for free meals. Call the school at 830-563-2491 ext. 554 if you have questions.

3. Should I fill out an application if I got a letter this school year saying my children are approved for free or reduced-price? In most cases no, however read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school at 830-563-2491 ext. 554 if you have questions.

4. Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free meals? Yes. If you have not been notified of free status under these categories, please call Brackett ISD to see if your child(ren) qualify.

5. Who can get reduced-priced meals? Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced-priced limits on the Federal Income Chart, included in this application packet.

6. I get WIC. Can my child(ren) get free meals? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced-priced meals. Please fill out an application.

7. Will the information I give be checked? Yes, we may ask you to sent written proof.

8. If I do not qualify now, may I apply later? Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year if your household size goes up, income goes down, or if you start getting food stamps, TANF or other benefits.

12. What if my income is not always the same? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally get \$1,000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only got \$900, put down that you get \$1,000 per month. If you normally get overtime pay, include that amount as income. If you do not normally get overtime pay, do not include it as income.

13. We are in the military; do we include our housing allowance as income? If you housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. All other allowances must be included in your gross income.

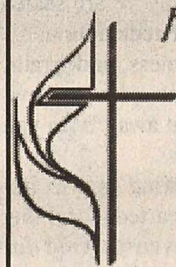

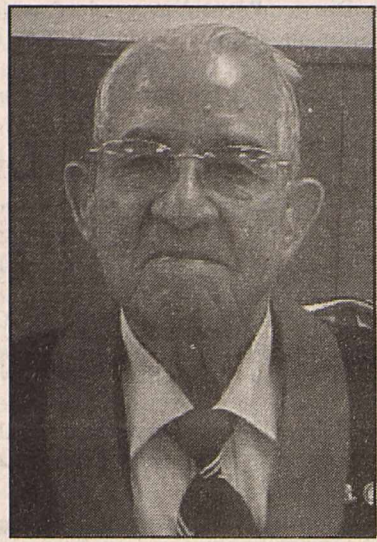

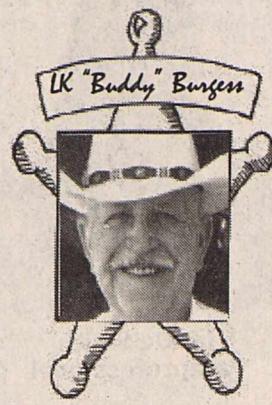
