In 1851, Foster wrote his known as "Suwannee River." Foster never visited Florida and would be in 1852 to New Orleans, by steamboat.

In 1854 Foster wrote "Jeanie With the Light Brown Hair," a love song inspired by the absence of his wife. Stephen Foster died in 1864, of alcoholism and a fall from his bed in New York City.

Shortly thereafter his renamed publishing company, William A. Pond Co., published the last song he wrote a few days before his death, "Beautiful Dreamer." During his lifetime he earned only \$15,091.08 in royalties from his sheet music. Sadly he died with 38 cents in
