This year, NWZAW will be observed April 19-23. Work zones can be hazardous for motorists as well as highway crews working to improve Texas' highways. TxDOT maintains approximately 80,000 miles of highway with more than 1,000 construction or maintenance projects underway at any given time.

PREDATOR MANAGEMENT
Workshop Date set for May The Texas Agrilife Extension Service in Kinney County will be having a Predator Management Workshop on May 10 at the Civic Center in Brackettville. Mark Mapston of the Texas Wildlife Services and Justin Henely of the State Health Department will be on hand to present and answer questions. This workshop is meant to educate area ranchers and the community on the physical evidence and biology of predators including coyotes, bobcats, birds of prey, and feral pigs. There will also be different control alternatives, and a presentation on predators as vectors of zoonotic disease. Fatal shooting not ambush

One young man now faces murder charges after reporting he and two friends were ambushed by undocumented aliens on April 10.

William M. Lloyd, 20, was taken into custody late Saturday after he claimed he was walking across a field on the Black Mountain Ranch in northern Kinney County with Reynaldo Rodriguez, 19, and Michael Hernandez, 19, when they were

ambushed by unknown gunmen hiding in the brush that resulted in Rodriguez being shot and killed. All three men were from Corpus Cristi.

According to information obtained at the Kinney County Sheriff's Department (KCSO), Lloyd initially claimed his friend, Rodriguez, was shot in the back by, "illegal aliens," and he and Hernandez carried his body back to their camp

about a mile away from the alleged accident scene. Lloyd reportedly stated he did not have cell phone service, so he and others proceeded to drive Rodriguez into Brackettville in a red Suburban.

A KCSO incident report filed at 4:25 p.m., stated the victim's friends flagged down a Kinney County resident on Highway 674 at Cedar Creek Road and asked her to call 911. KCSO

deputies responded immediately and were assisted by Texas Ranger Juan Lozano, Texas Department of Public Safety troopers and aircraft, United States Border Patrol agents, K9s and aircraft, Kinney County Constable Bobby Guidry and Texas Game Warden Rob Frets.

Interviews later revealed Lloyd was the gunman that fatally shot Rodriguez in the back. Lloyd will be charged with mur-

der according to information released on April 14.

Kinney County Judge Tim Ward was the magistrate and declared Rodriguez dead at 6:35 p.m. Ward ordered an autopsy and Rodriguez was taken to Bexar County Medical Examiner's office in San Antonio.

It is unknown if Hernandez will face any charges. The shooting is still under investigation.

The Kinney County Groundwater Conservation District is sponsoring a poster contest for students who reside in Kinney County and are in grades 1-6. The poster artwork must recognize the importance of sav-



ing water, for example; repairing leaks, installing water efficient fixtures and appliances, turning off the water while brushing teeth, taking shorter showers and landscaping using native and adaptive plants that require less water.

The artwork will be judged on creativity, relevance to the contest theme "Reduce Your Water Footprint", legibility and adherence to the contest guidelines. Each entry must be the work of one student and it must be turned in to the Jones Elementary School office no later than 3:30 p.m. on Friday May 7.

A copy of the contest rules and the entry forms can be picked up at the Elementary School office.

There will be one Grand Prize winner, and honorable mention winners will be selected for grades 1-6. The Grand Prize winner will receive an award yet to be determined along with a plaque and a participation certificate. The honorable mention winners will receive a plaque and a certificate recognizing their participation. The teacher-team leader of the Grand Prize winner will receive a \$200 voucher for school and or art supplies; the teacher-team leader of the honorable mention grade 1-6 winners will each receive a \$100 voucher for school-art supplies.

All winners will be recognized at the KCGCD meeting on Thursday, May 13.

Oh my goodness! I didn't know I did that! Thank you Brackett News for setting the record straight in the minds of your readers.

I commend the tenacity of the Brackett News reporter who was hiding in the weeds with a sophisticated listening device and managed to pick up on the word "stupid."

I read and re-read the statements/affidavits filed for record by both parties and could find no evidence of the word "stupid" ever being uttered. I extend my profound gratitude for your high ethical standards and uncompromisingly accurate reporting of events.

I apologize for not checking with the Brackett News to determine my actual punishment. Like a fool I went with the official "Order of Disposition" I received from Justice of the Peace Narce D. Villarreal which states:

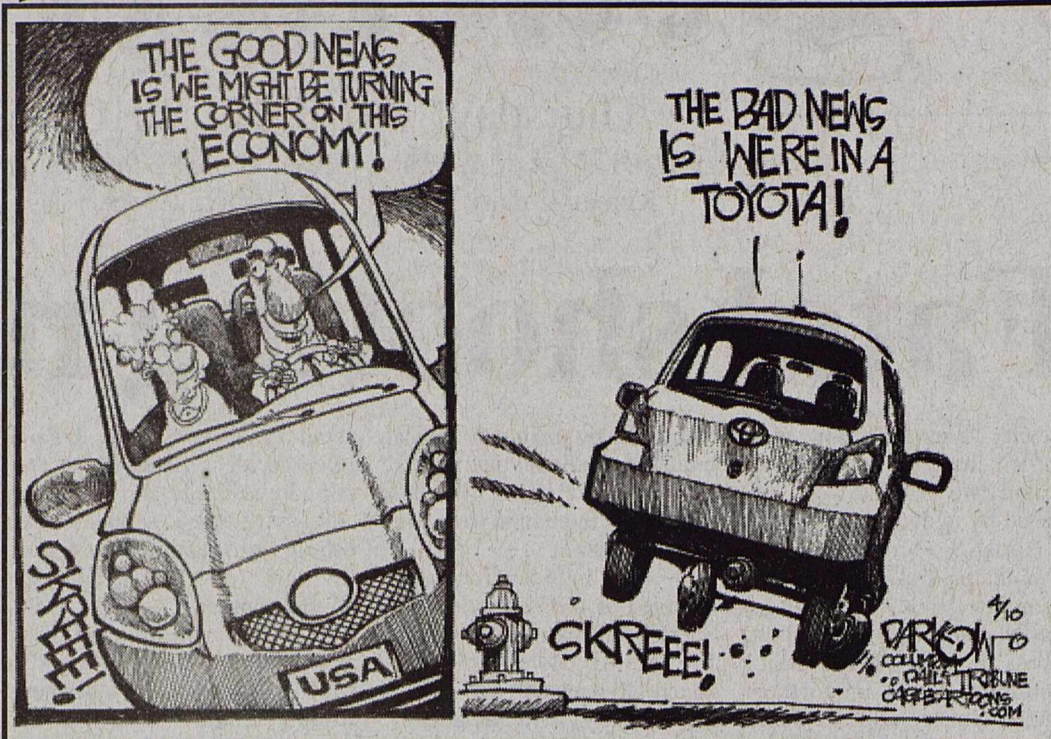
I certainly didn't realize my community service was actually 10 times that much at 250 hours. Thank you once again for getting that critical fact spot on.

I have already begun my 24 hours of community service by meeting with Alma Gutierrez, Principal of Jones Elementary, to schedule visits to the County Heritage Museum and the Old Guardhouse Museum for her students and I have met with Brackettville City Manager Henry Garcia to secure his blessing for development of a "Walking Tour" brochure of the Original Town of Brackett. I am confident the Brackett News will want to track the fulfillment of my 24 hours of community service to the second, simply for its spellbinding news value.

I have attached my sworn affidavit and the court's "Order of Disposition" to assist in your legal defense if required. I have also attached the press release and photo sent to you by the Kinney County Historical Commission two weeks ago. I guess you misplaced the originals since the good news has yet to be published in your paper.

Improving the Brackett High Band

It has been my privilege during this school year to work with your children who play brass instruments in the Brackett Jr. High Band and Sr. High Band. I have been giving individual and group instruction to trumpet, trombone, and euphonium players during the first period and third period on Wednesday mornings. On two occasions I have had the opportunity to teach the fundamentals of scales and musical terminology at the blackboard in the band room.

Ms. Hunter, the band director tells me that I have made a difference in the band. I give her all the credit. From what I have seen she has a far greater effect due to her day to day involvement over the past two years.

However, she can not do it all. The number one problem that I have seen is the lack of available music teachers for all instrument players. The number two problem is a prevailing unwillingness among our youth, as a group, to invest the time necessary to master their instruments. There are not enough hours in the week for Ms. Hunter to give individual instruction to each student musician and students who won't practice outside the classroom can not master their instrument even with the outstanding introductory materials the community supplies to the music department.

To help alleviate these two problems I offer the community the following help for as long as I am able to do so.

Wanted, Trumpet, Trombone, Euphonium, and Tuba Players. No Experience Necessary.

1. My child and I will meet with the band director between now and the end of this school year and obtain an instrument to take home for the summer and a beginner's self teaching instruction book. 2. I will arrange a time with Mr. James Reesman (563-3381) for one, one hour lesson per week during this summer to be held at his home, 581 Ft. Clark Road and will pay \$1.00 per lesson to help defray the costs of Xeroxing teaching materials that he will use in teaching music terms and theory as part of each lesson. 3. I will transport my child to and from his or her lessons at Mr. Reesman's Home if they are unable to get there on their own with their instrument. 4. I will sign my student's practice log each time they practice to verify that they did in fact perform the practice recorded in it. 5. As a student I will practice at home at least four, half hour periods per week during the summer, and at least two half hour periods per week while school is in session. 6. As a student, I will obtain a pocket notebook and enter into it the date, starting time and ending time of each practice session

and a short description of what I practiced during that time. I will get my parent or guardian to initial each entry to verify it was done. I will also enter the definition of any musical terms that I learn so that my parents can see what I am learning. 7. As a student, I will add at least two new notes per week to my range until I can play two full octaves in range by the end of the year.

In return for this degree of commitment from student and family members I believe that we can greatly improve the brass section of the junior and senior bands between now and the end of 2010. I will accept applications for up to six students for the summer. My priority for students, based on the band's needs, is trombone, tuba, trumpet, and euphonium, in that order. I will be out of town from the eighth to the eighteenth of June but your student will be assigned enough things to practice to get through that two week period and I will test them on it upon my return. Each hour session will consist of 1/2 hour of testing and review, and one half hour of instruction in new concepts and playing of new material. Students who fail to meet the contract requirements will be dropped and I will seek other students who will meet them.

If there is anyone on the community who can make a summer commitment to teach woodwind or percussion instruments under the same contract conditions, your aid would be greatly appreciated.

The Texas Perimeter Hike

"I was born upon the prairie, where the wind blew free and there was nothing to break the light of the sun. I was born where there were no enclosures and where everything drew a free breath." - Ten Bears of the Yamparika Comanches



I wake up around dawn, and I know something has changed. My nose feels it, then my hands as I unzip my sleeping bag. The air is crisp as I twist around and look outside my tarp. Then I see it coming down, slow and unhurried, falling silently and muffling the sounds of the world. It's my first Texas snow.

I'm volunteering at the magical Caprock Canyons State Park, where in one week it has snowed, rained, and been sunny about evenly. After hiking so much road it is a gentle relief to be in a natural area. I've been here almost a month now, though most of the last week I've been sick. I came wanting to explore the canyons, learn about the plains and its history, and perhaps give my feet a break. I haven't been disappointed. To get here, I hiked south along the Caprock Canyons Trailway, a separate 64-mile stretch of park property running from Estelline to South Plains. I ran into a lot of wild pigs, several deer, and one armadillo. One evening I heard strange noises nearby, like dumping water from a small-lipped container. In the morning I woke up to the same noise, accompanied by the flapping of dozens of wings. I looked up and saw over 100 wild turkeys just a few yards away.

Winter is the slow season at Caprock Canyons, slow for volunteers at any rate. Because of the weather, it's hard to plan on anything other than the day at hand. I found myself doing odd tasks, running a children's discovery center, helping to take out nails from an old fence, assembling some armoires. The most official task I had was to give a few Saturday talks about my hiking trips to visitors. The people that work at Caprock are a family unto themselves. The guys harass one another, and the women ask how everyone is doing. The rangers usually have enough computer work to keep them busy all day, but they are more than happy to answer questions and help someone out. Many times, that has been me.

One day in the park office, I told the staff that I heard an unusual noise the night before. Sort of like a horse whinnying but not quite, I said. It was hard for me to be more precise. A ranger and a volunteer both gave me their best guesses, but neither was certain. Then Park Manager Donald Beard said from his office, "Did it sound like this?" I heard the noise again, a little high-pitched and shaky, almost eerie. That's it, I said. "Screech owl," he added simply, returning to his work.

I explored the park during other days. A friend visited, and we found our way to the top of Haynes Ridge Trail. The weather was cloudy and subdued, but we had a great time swapping stories and eating dinner. In the morning, we hiked to the overlook and spent an hour and a half admiring the canyon views while eating breakfast. We sat on top of the world. One hundred thirty-five years ago, the last of the free Comanches roamed these plains and wintered in these panhandle canyons. You don't have to look hard to find what they were fighting for. Their reasons are still here. They are in the water, animals, and open air; they are in the very dirt.

Look for ways to cut investment taxes

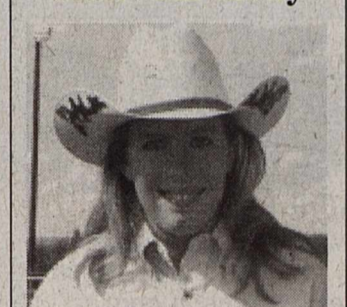

Spinal screening offered at school

The Texas State Legislature passed a law in 1985 that requires all sixth and ninth grade students to be screened for spinal deformities. Early detection of abnormal spinal curvature can prevent serious health problems. This is a problem that may begin during the early adolescent years (from 10-14 years of age), with an estimated 1 in 10 adolescents having some degree of abnormal curvature. Curves that are detected early may only require periodic observation by a specialist. Moderate curves may require the wearing of a brace, which is usually super-

vised by an orthopedic specialist. In most cases, the need for major surgery for this deformity can be eliminated through early detection. Spinal screening for Brackett High School ninth grade students has been scheduled to Tuesday April 20. Children will be screened for two types of spinal deformities: scoliosis and kyphosis. Scoliosis is a condition in which the spine is twisted, causing misalignment of the upper body or lower back. This condition can worsen and lead to much pain, as well as complications of the heart and lungs. Kyphosis is an exaggerated rounding of the spine. Progression of these two conditions can often be arrested if detected early. For more in-
