Monsserrad Montelongo is entered in the Tiny Miss division.

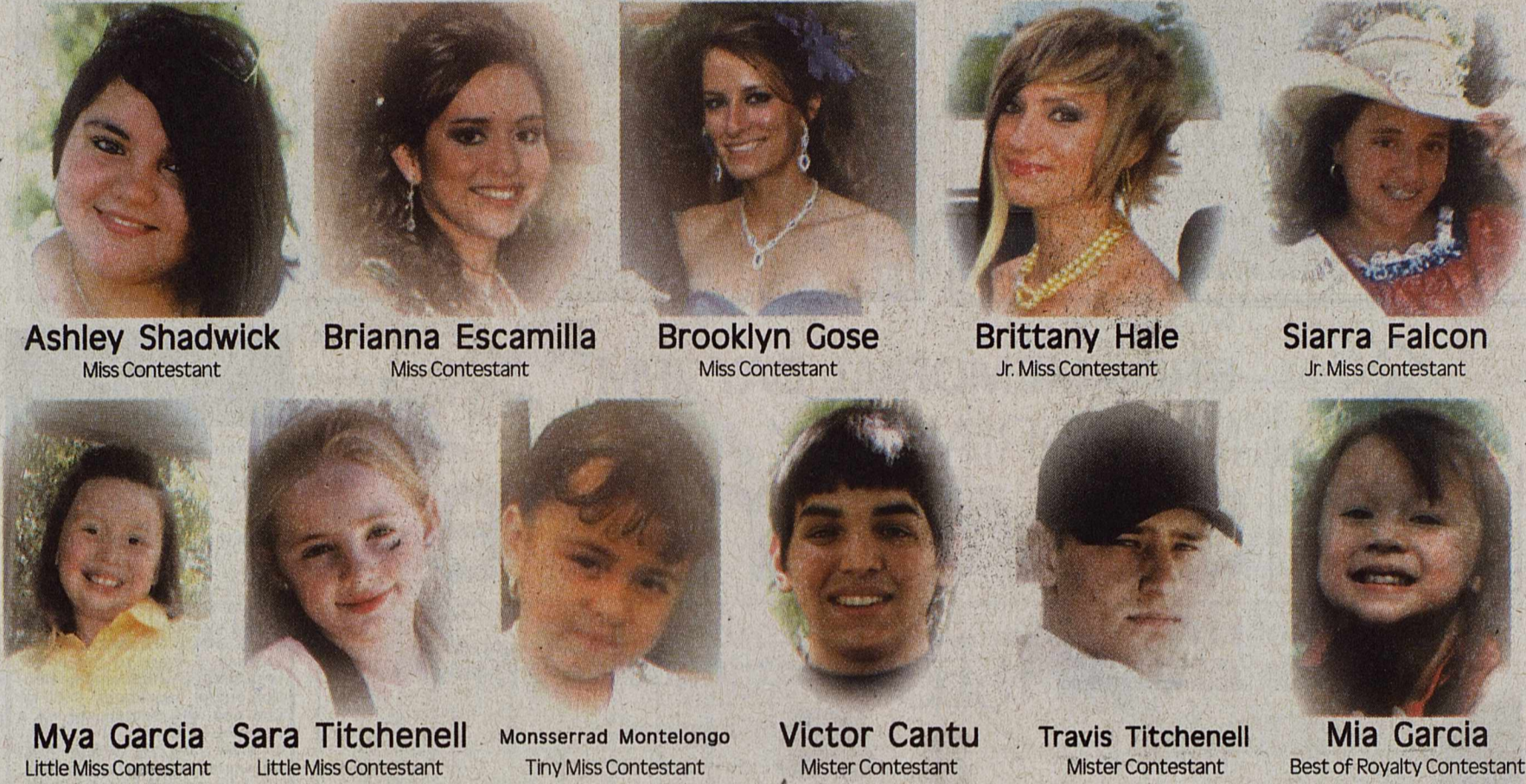
Victor Cantu and Travis Titchenell are candidates for Mr. Kinney County.

Cantu has been already accepted to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology to study chemical engineering. Cantu plans to become a cardiothoracic surgeon.

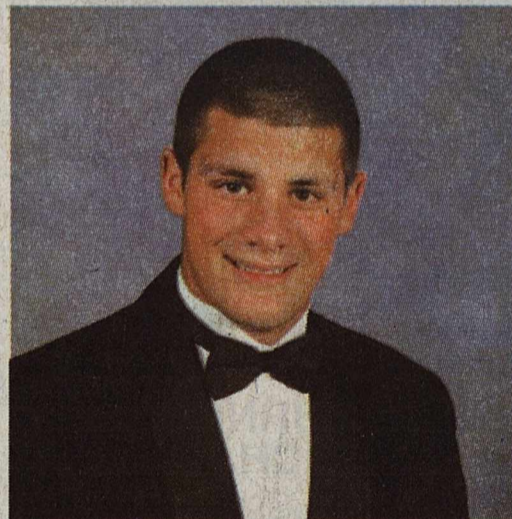
Cantu offered this advice to his peers, "Don't underestimate yourself and don't think you cannot do something, don't settle."

Cantu said he was successful because he was really focused. "I knew what I wanted and I knew what I had to do to get there."

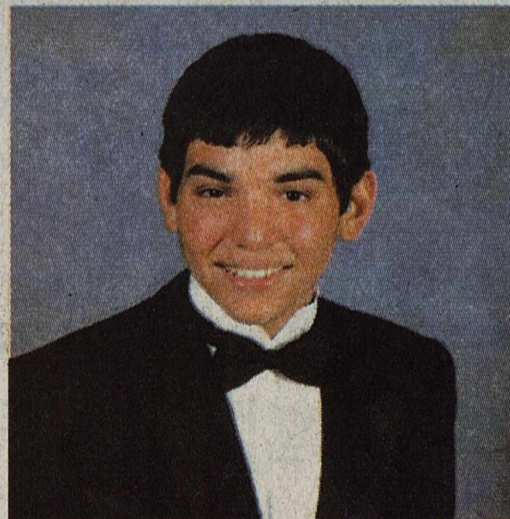
When asked about moving to drastically colder climate, Cantu laughed and said he had not yet bought a coat, snow boots or any gloves.

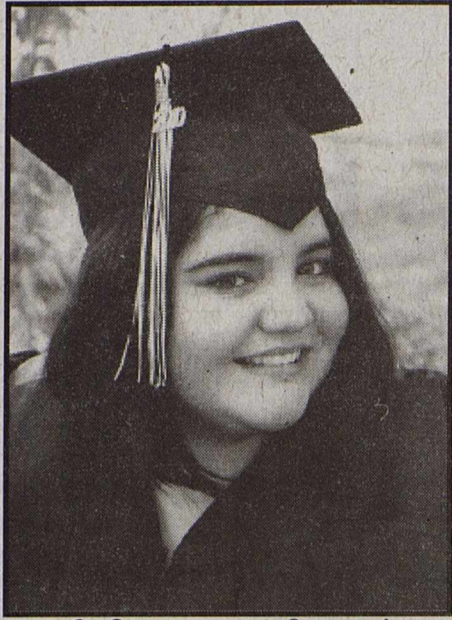

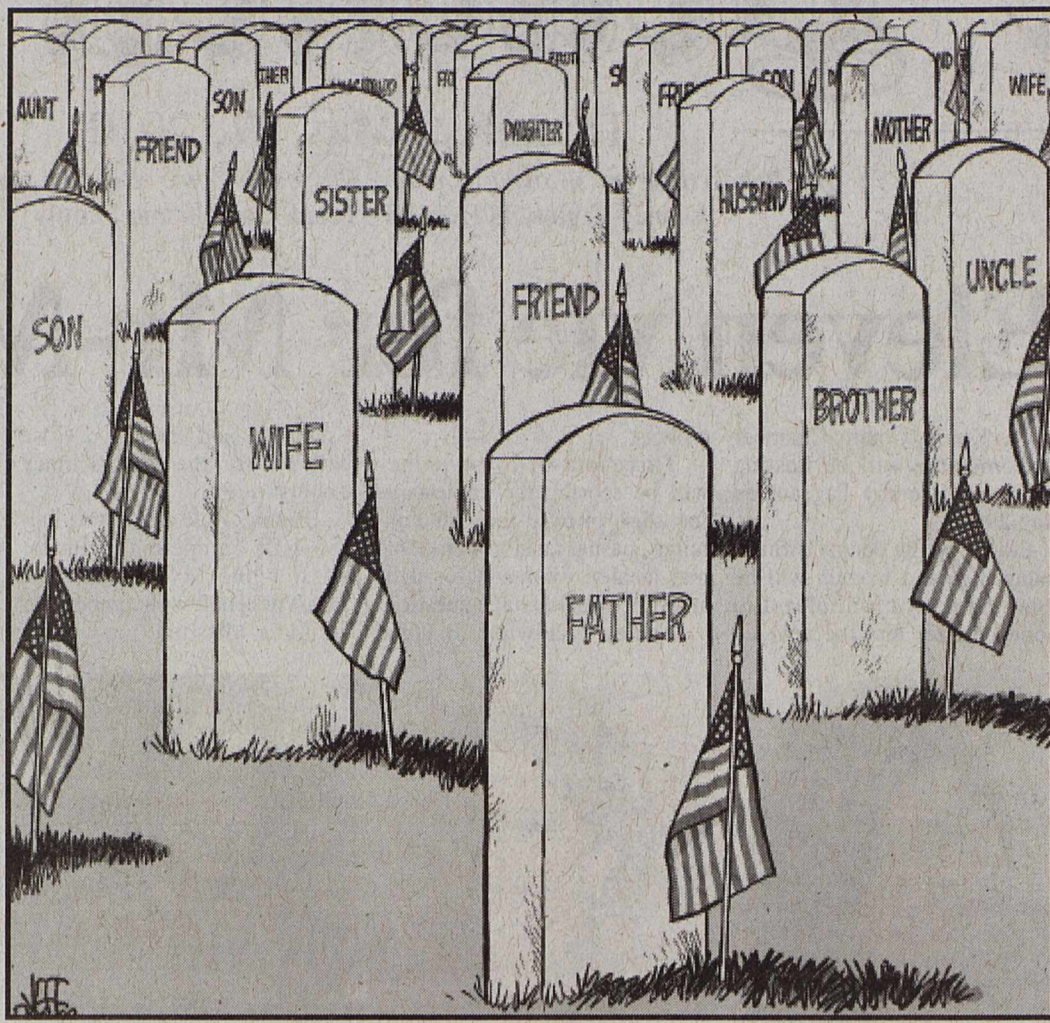

Like the benefits of a 401(k) or an IRA? Check out the 529 plan

If you have young children, the end of another school year means you are now one year closer to the day when you send them to college — and one year closer to dealing with the high costs of higher education. However, you still have time to save and invest — and one of the best investment choices you can make is a Section 529 college savings plan.

In fact, a 529 plan contains, in just one account, some of the key advantages found in other attractive investment vehicles, such as a 401(k) or IRA. Consider the following:

• Tax-advantaged earnings — Roth IRA earnings accumulate tax free and are distributed tax free, provided the account is at least five years old and the account owner doesn't start taking withdrawals until at least age 59½. Similarly, a 529 plan's earnings accumulate tax free and are distributed tax free, provided they are used for qualified higher education expenses. (Keep in mind, though, that 529 plan distributions not used for qualified expenses may be subject to federal and state income tax and a 10% penalty.) Furthermore, your 529 plan contributions may be deductible from your state taxes. However, 529 plans vary, so be sure to check with your tax advisor.

• High contribution limits — For 2010, you can put up to \$16,500 into a 401(k) plan, or \$22,000 if you're 50 or older. If you have an IRA, you can contribute up to \$5,000 in 2010, or \$6,000 if you're 50 or older. The lifetime contribution limits for 529 plans may be more generous. While the limits vary by state, many plans allow contributions in excess of \$200,000, according to the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. Contributions to 529 plans are considered gifts; therefore, the \$13,000 gift limit should be considered.

• Asset allocation — One key to being a successful investor is choosing the mix of investments — such as stocks, bonds and government securities — that are appropriate for your risk tolerance and time horizon. A professional financial advisor can help you create a suitable asset allocation for your 401(k), IRA or other investment accounts. Most 529 plans also offer an asset allocation strategy, typically based on the age of the child or the number of years until college enrollment. For example, if your child is younger, your plan might start off with a higher percentage of aggressive investments in order to maximize your growth potential. As your child gets closer to college, the plan may take a more conservative approach to help reduce the effects of volatility before you start tapping into the plan.

Clearly, a 529 plan has much in common with popular investment vehicles, but it has other characteristics of which you'll want to be aware. For one thing, the financial aid impact: Assets in a 529 plan are considered an asset of the account owner, usually the parent. Federal financial aid formulas generally expect parents to use a smaller percentage of their assets for college funding. Consequently, you'll want to explore all aspects of any 529 plan, possibly in consultation with your financial and tax advisors, before taking action. But don't wait too long — your children will move from day care to dormitories in what seems like a blink of an eye.

As you probably know, Brackett ISD is in the midst of a construction project. Currently, we are renovating a house across from the gym. This facility will become the district's central office building, which will be more centrally located to the entire district. This project should be completed in July and we should be moved in and ready to go for the 2010 - 2011 school year.

By moving across the street we will free up our current facilities and utilize them in a different fashion. We currently utilize portable buildings to house various departments. With the move across the street, we will restructure things in such a manner as to bring these departments into the permanent buildings. Our English as a Second Language department, Bilingual department, School Nurse will all move from portables into the a permanent building. Furthermore, we will also be able to house our Special Education department in one centralized location. This will allow us remove the portables or utilize them in a different manner.

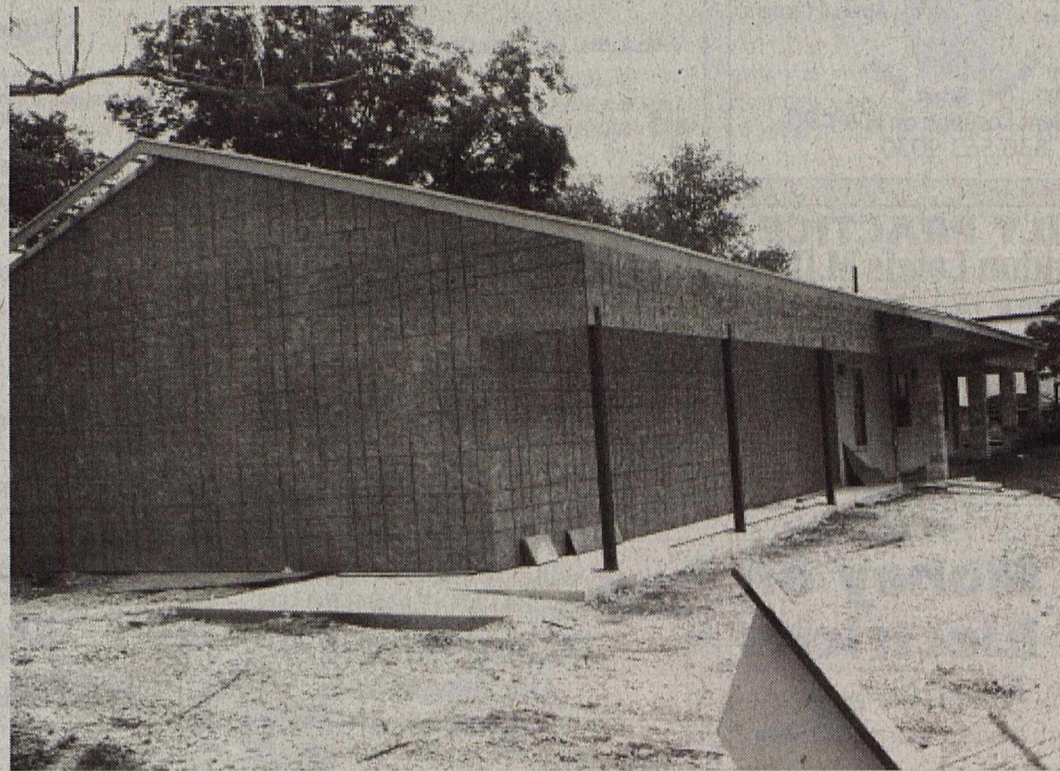
In addition, we have established a facilities committee that

has examined the districts facilities. This committee is comprised of district administrators, teachers, students, parents, and community members. This committee has gone through a process of identifying needs in the district and has worked with Randy Fromberg of Fromberg

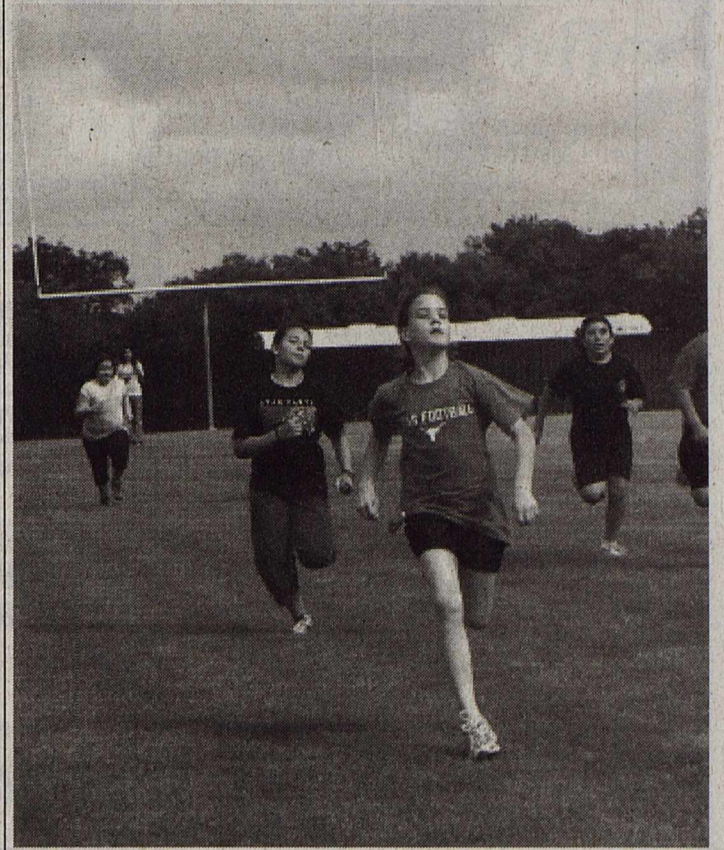

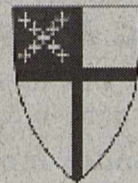

Development of a Hazard Mitigation Plan for the Middle Rio Grande Border Region

The Rio Grande Institute, in partnership with the Middle Rio Grande Development Council and Sul Ross University, is developing a *Cover the Border Hazard Mitigation Plan for the Middle Rio Grande Border Region*. The Plan is funded under a grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and will cover cities and counties in a nine-county area, including Val Verde, Maverick, Kinney, Dimmit, Edwards, LaSalle, Real, Uvalde and Zavala Counties.

The Plan is intended to reduce the long-term risk of loss of life and property damage from disasters. Disasters to be addressed include floods, dam inundation, levee failure, drought, tornadoes, high winds, hurricanes, wildland fires, hail, winter storms, extreme heat, fuel pipeline accidents, hazardous materials incidents and other hazards.

We are seeking public input into the development of the plan. Public comments will be sought on disasters of concern and recommendations for actions to prevent future disaster damage. Public meetings will be held in three locations throughout the Region:

Local resident Rocco Fortunato awarded Texas Music Hall of Fame honors



Billy Mata, the Ambassador of Western Swing and each of the members of his band, The Texas Tradition, including Brackettville resident, Rocco Fortunato, were honored by their peers in the rich history and tradition of Western Swing music at the 22nd Annual Texas Western Swing Hall Of Fame Induction Ceremony, in San Marcos, Texas on May 15.

The Texas Western Swing Hall Of Fame adds inductees annually, focusing on recognizing both the pioneers of Western Swing and notable artists and personalities who currently represent this industry and genre.

This year's inductees include

Mata and his band, Jason Roberts - fiddler, Buck Roberts - band leader, Gene Niven - steel guitar, Denny Mathis - steel guitar, Alvin Crow - fiddle, James and Annetta White and the Broken Spoke dancehall, and Dr. Charles Townsend - author and Western Swing historian.

The Texas Tradition includes Richard Helsley - fiddle, Roger Edgington - steel guitar, David Waters - guitar, Bill Holt - upright bass, and Rocco Fortunato - drums. The band was featured in performance at the Hall Of Fame Show and dance that followed the induction ceremony at the San Marcos Plaza by the River.

Rocco Fortunato came to Brackettville, Texas, in 1981 at the invitation of Alamo Village's Happy Shahan to work with RCA artist Valentino. Rocco was music director, road business manager and drummer, touring with Valentino in venues from the Canadian border to Mexico City, and from New Orleans to Reno, Nevada. In 1989, he began working for Billy Mata & the Texas Tradition based in San Antonio. He remained as a resident of Brackettville because, as he said, "After so many years on the road, it is such a safe and sane place to live."

Now a twenty year veteran with the Texas Tradition, Rocco plays drums, sings, and has co-produced all four of Billy Mata's national award nominated CD albums featuring Mata's love for Bob Wills style Western Swing music. Mata's most recent album, "This Is Tommy Duncan, Volume One" is a tribute to Bob Wills and His Texas Playboys' original style setting vocalist, and won the Academy of Western Artists Will Rogers Award for 2009 Western Swing Album of the Year.

The Texas Tradition has kept Fortunato busy traveling all over Texas with regular excursions to the Sacramento Jazz Jubilee and the San Diego Dixieland Jazz Festival in California, and the Hot Jazz Jubilee in Victoria, British Columbia. Mata's album radio play is international and featured on Sirius/XM Radio. The band has traveled to Poland as the first Western Swing act ever to do so and has sponsored a Western Swing band from Scotland to a concert in Texas

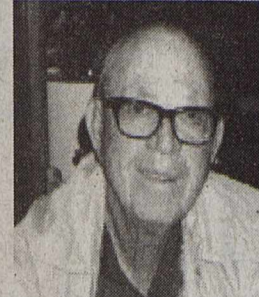
to help keep the tradition of Western Swing alive all over the world.

Originally from State College, Pennsylvania, Fortunato graduated from Penn State University in 1969 with a major in Psychology and minors in Music and Broadcasting. He attended Union Theological Seminary in New York City for graduate work. In addition to his music, he has held a variety of jobs, including camera operator and stage manager for PBS station WPSX-TV, Executive Director of a state-funded teen group home, wholesale electronics sales, and as Assistant Film Technician at Penn State University. As a recording engineer, Rocco has produced many genres of music in studios in New York, Pennsylvania, Bristol and Nashville, Tennessee, and Texas.

Rocco lives in Brackettville with his wife, Monea, who is a Gifted and Talented Instructor at Calderon Elementary school in Del Rio. Together, they have made themselves responsible for the livelihood and happiness of some extremely fortunate feline companions.

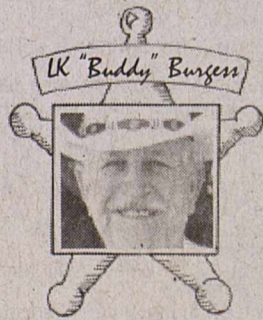
