2010 YOUTH RANGE WORKSHOP
SARAH DAVIS has been selected to attend the 2010 Youth Range Workshop at the Texas Tech University Center in Junction, Texas on June 20-25, 2010. County selection of participants involved in 4-H and FFA programs was based on outstanding projects, leadership, and interest in range and natural resource management. A new school logo was unveiled at the Brackett High Athletic Banquet on Monday, May 29.

The new logo, designed by BHS Junior Haley Hale, was the most popular choice in a recent contest sponsored by the Athletic Booster Club.

The club invited the public

to design a new logo for the school and received a total of 12 entries. Nearly 400 students, teachers and parents participated in the process and chose Hale's compact, yet fitting, rendition of a fighting tiger in the traditional black and yellow-gold.

Hale is the daughter of Chad

and Pam Hale and was recently nominated the Most Creative student in her junior class.

"It's amazing to be the winner. It's also nice to know that once I graduate next year, the logo I created will last for many years to come," said Hale.

In October, 2007, the school district was forced to look for a

new logo when the tiger head being used at the time was nearly identical to that copyrighted by University of Missouri and selected a temporary design. The Missouri-style logo had been in use by the school for seven years, but the Collegiate Licensing Company demanded the BHS stop using it.

Unfortunately for the district, the price tag to phase it out was estimated by the district office at the time to be nearly \$50,000.

Temperature and rainfall records for Brackettville began in August 1852 shortly after Fort Clark was established. Records indicated the Post Surgeon and/or the Signal Officer were in charge of composing weather reports from 1852 to 1931. At first, only monthly weather reports were composed by the officers of the post. From 1887 to 1931, daily weather values were obtained and filed.

On April 15, 1935 the City of Brackettville assumed the responsibility for measuring, recording and reporting daily rainfall amounts for Brackettville. In 1953, temperature readings were again added to the weather observing duties. During the past 75 years, the location of the rain gauge and thermometers changed several times, but always remained within a couple of miles of downtown. For a couple of years, from 2006 to 2009, Fort Clark Springs took over the charge for recording the weather elements.

But on January 6, 2010 the weather equipment was Moved back into the city, and the City

of Brackettville once again assumed the duties. April 15, 2010 marked the 75th anniversary since the City of Brackettville first began logging weather and climate information for Brackettville, Texas. The efforts and energy expended to measure, record and report daily temperature and precipitation data has contributed vastly to local, state and national weather and climate databases. The information collected by the City of Brackettville is utilized by innumerable individuals and agencies

of Brackettville once again assumed the duties. April 15, 2010 marked the 75th anniversary since the City of Brackettville first began logging weather and climate information for Brackettville, Texas. The efforts and energy expended to measure, record and report daily temperature and precipitation data has contributed vastly to local, state and national weather and climate databases. 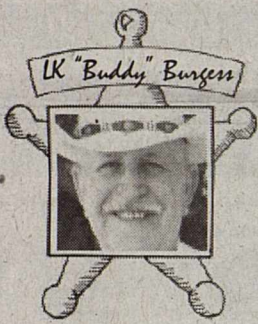
