## Judge Ward talks paths, paved roads & playgrounds for Brackett

Kinney County Judge Tim Ward announced the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will begin to repave some roads in Brackettville over the next year.

The golf cart path being sponsored by the City of Brackettville and Kinney County will begin as soon as TxDOT releases the materials recently requested by the two governmental agencies.

The new golf cart path will cross over Highway 90 from the entrance of Fort Clark Springs; cut between the Jug Store and the Tru-Life Taxidermy buildings on the north side of the highway; cross over Spring Street; cut between the Civic Center and Sunset Funeral Homes on the north side of Spring; ending at Louise Street.

Along with the paved cart path, TxDOT will be installing automatic warning signs to alert automobiles traveling east and

west on Highway 90 to be careful of carts crossing the road ahead.

The state also approved the use of the funds left over from the Spofford road paving project to be used to repair the sections of Fulton, Fort and Thomas streets that surround Brackett ISD. The work is expected to start in October, 2011.

TxDOT District Engineer Albert Quintanilla said other projects slated for the new year include rebuilding Spring Street,

also known as Loop 166; rebuilding Ann Street from Highway 90 through town and up to approximately six miles outside of Camp Wood; and installing 14 passing lanes between the Kinney County line west at Sycamore Creek through Brackettville, to the Uvalde City Limit. Each passing zone will be two miles in length.

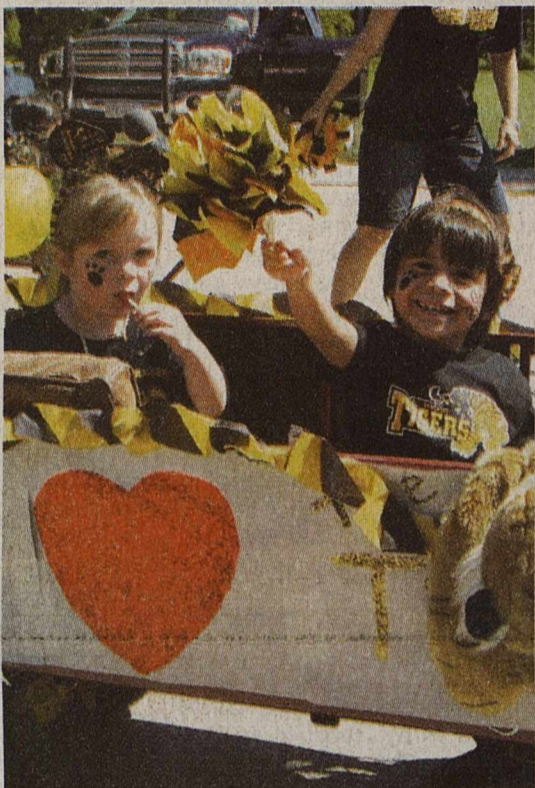
Also discussed was the creation of some decorative stucco and stone welcome signs to be installed at the east and west

ends of Brackettville on Highway 90.

Ward also said in an interview on October 5, he had submitted an application to the Hillcrest Foundation in Dallas for several different projects.

The first project includes plans to restore the District Courtroom on the second floor of the courthouse; improvements to the EMS buildings and a \$15,000 request for playground equipment at the swim park facility.

Courtney Kirkland, now 17, found a penny on the floor while at the Kinney County Wool & Mohair in 2003.

Kirkland picked up the penny and tried to give it to Tony Frerich, an owner of the woolhouse, but he told her to keep it and give it back to him when she graduated from high school.

The young Kirkland took the penny home and kept it in a box with all her keepsakes for a while. Later she framed the penny and kept it in her room.

"When Mr. Frerich told me

to give it back to him when I graduated, I did not see why at all. It was only a penny. Graduating seemed so far away at the time and when you are in school, you will scarf up any sort of change just to buy cheese sticks at Lopez (Bakery). After it was framed was when I really started to put a thought behind it. And now to give it back means so much. 'Just a penny,' turned into a gift and it meant something to me."

Kirkland, originally part of the Class of 2011, graduated on September 13, at a Regular Brackett ISD school board meeting. Kirkland completed dual credit courses last year at

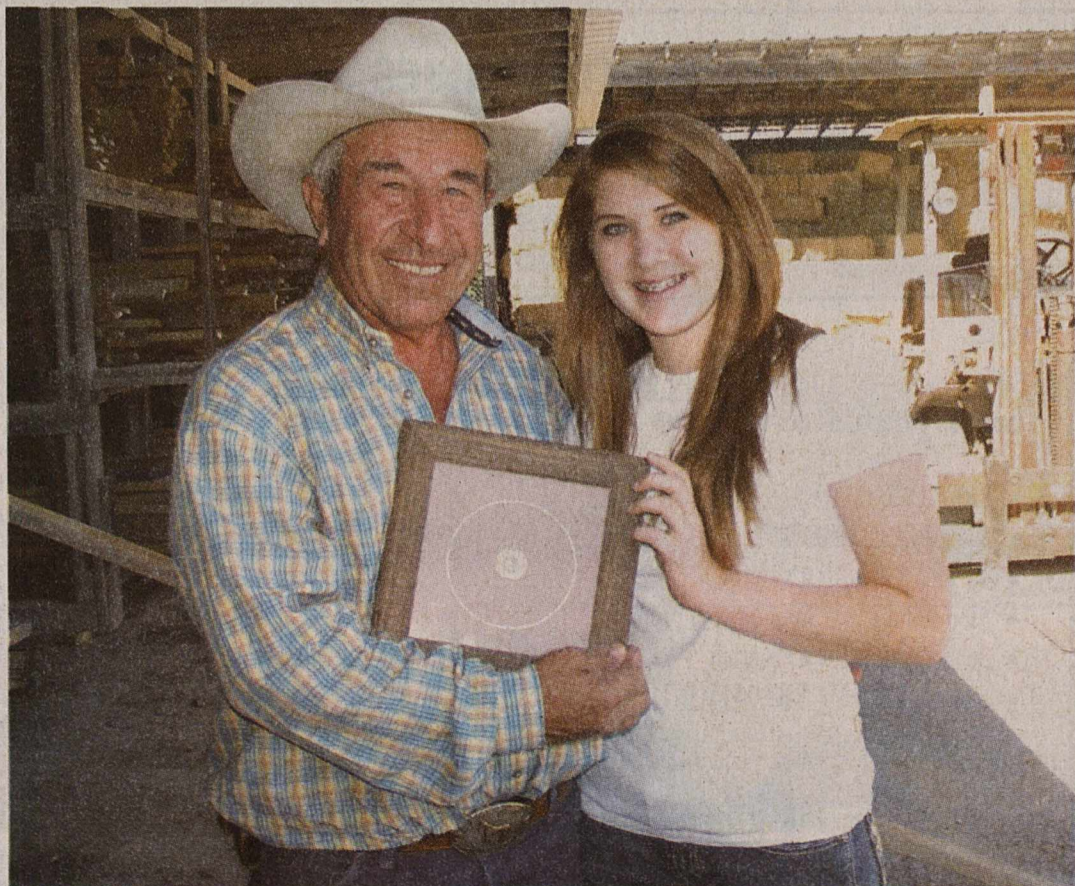
Brackett High and again this past summer at Southwest Texas Junior College in Uvalde, to obtain enough credits to graduate a year early.

After receiving her diploma, Kirkland made a point to visit the woolhouse to finally return the penny to Frerich.

Frerich humbly accepted the framed penny and said he did not know such a small gesture would have turned out to mean so much to Kirkland.

Frerich congratulated Kirkland and encouraged her to obtain a college degree.

Kirkland is living in Uvalde and will resume classes at the junior college in January.

## Hunter's education class offered

Game wardens Rob Frets and Dayton Isaacs will host a hunter's education class on October 23 and 24.

Registration for the two day course will begin on Saturday, October 23 at 8 a.m., followed by the class until 5 p.m. and resume on Sunday at 8 a.m. until noon. Classes will be held at the Brackett High School Ag Shop, next to the main high school building on Fulton Street.

The cost will be \$15 per person. The class is a 12 hour course and everyone must attend all 12 hours to successfully complete the course and be certified.

Every hunter born on or after September 2, 1971, must successfully complete a Hunter Education Training Course. Hunters of all ages are welcome to attend. A parent or other relative is encouraged to attend with their child. The minimum age of certification is 9 years old. In other words, you must be nine years old at the start of the course.

Hunters born on or after September 2, 1971 must complete this course to hunt. You can be issued a

citation if you hunt and have not received this training.

This course is good for life. It has to be completed only one time. Other state may require that a hunter complete a Hunter Safety or Education Course before hunting there. This course meets the requirements necessary for hunting out of state.

A minimum of five students is required for the course to be offered.

Additional Information: If you were born on or after September 2, 1971, and you are: age 17 and over, you must successfully complete a hunter education course to hunt; age 9 through 16, you must successfully complete a hunter education course or be accompanied by a licensed hunter 17 years of age or older when hunting; under 9 years of age, you must be accompanied by a licensed hunter 17 years of age or older when hunting. You are not old enough to take the course and be certified.

Jesus Antonio Costilla-Salinas was indicted for possession of cocaine, less than one gram in March of this year.

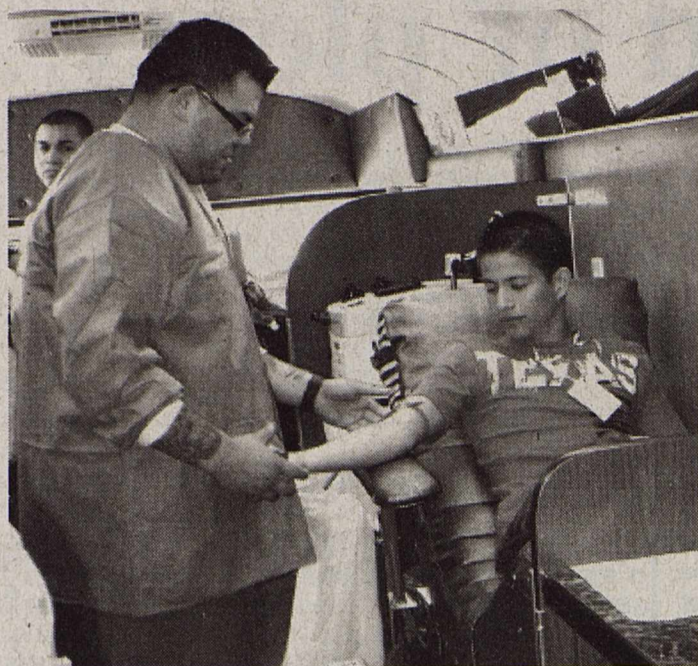
Justin Chapa was indicted for possession of marijuana in the amount of less than 2,000 pounds, but more than 50 pounds in August.

Well, I have reached a point in my life where I would have to agree with them. Time truly does seem to go by faster as we get older.

**Open House** - We are hosting an Open House for our new central office building on Monday, October 11<sup>th</sup> from 5:30 - 6:30, with our regular monthly board meeting beginning at 6:30. Please stop by and visit and take the opportunity to see our new facilities.

**UIL** - Several of us from the school recently attended a district organizational meeting. As a result of the meeting, we will once again be hosting the elementary and junior high academic meet this year. This contest will take place on December 11<sup>th</sup>. Also, we will be hosting the zone One Act Play Contest. This will take place on March 23, 2011 at Southwest Texas Junior College in Uvalde.

**Safety** - Our safety committee meets quarterly to review both student and employee accidents as well as examine in

safety concerns throughout the district. One of the concerns expressed at our first meeting this year revolves around students crossing Ann Street to get to the parking lot. Quite often, we have students getting back after dark from ballgames, various s contest, and field trips. School safety is the responsibility of everyone - staff, students, parents, and the community. An audit can provide a snapshot of the school's safety and identify areas needing improvement. Among the areas examined in the audit are the following: Safety and security of site and building exterior Access control Safety and security of building interior Type and extent of monitoring and surveillance Communication and information security Development of emergency operations plans School climate and culture.

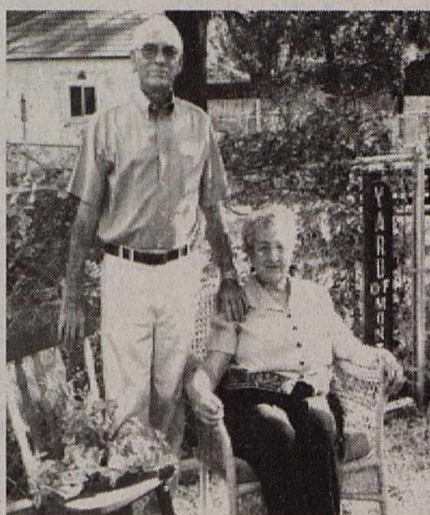
## OBITUARY Star Vance Smith

recently received notice from the Texas Department of Transportation's District Office in Laredo the approval and use of \$107,000.00 of Border Colonia Access Funds. These BCAP funds have been identified for street paving improvements in Brackettville, accordingly to Tim Ward, Kinney County Judge. Kinney County was awarded a Border Colonia Access Program grant from TX. DOT in 2008 for first time paving activities for colonia residents in Kinney County. The grant in the amount of \$855,000.00 identified first time paving activities for the recognized colonia of Spofford in Kinney County. Once all paving activities were completed in Spofford, Kinney County requested these remaining funds be used within the City of Brackettville. However, at that time Brackettville was not officially recognized nor identified as an economically distressed community by the Texas Water Development Board, stated Judge Ward. Through the efforts of Kinney County materials supporting the inclusion of the City of Brackettville as an economically distressed community were submitted to the Texas Water Development Board. As a result of those efforts the City of Brackettville has since been included on the Boards list and been assigned a colonia identification number of M1360002. This recognition of Brackettville by the Texas Water Development Board has allowed these funds to now be used for paving activities in Brackettville, in addition for the possibility of additional financial assistance in future announcements. The streets, which have been identified to receive the benefits from these funds, include all three city owned streets around the Brackettville School. These improvements should be complete by the end of 2010, stated Judge Ward. In addition Kinney County recently submitted a Texas Community Development Block Grant Application to the Texas Department of Rural Affairs requesting an additional \$227,293.00 for street paving improvements in Brackettville. The streets identified in the application to receive the benefits include Gove Street from E. Military Highway to Third Street and Beaumont Street from W. Military Highway to W. Fulton Street.
