- Diane Ward and Elizabeth Goebel are volunteer co-chairpersons of the Kinney County Church Alliance Food Pantry
- Leigh Jenkins is our volunteer initiating director
- There are about 30 volunteers we call on for help
- There are donors who give monthly so the Kinney County Church Alliance can pay the "fair share" fee per bag to have the good bagged and delivered from Laredo
- There are groups who donate "fundraising" winnings and individuals who make larger donations at times
- It is truly neighbors helping neighbors under the umbrella of the Kinney County Church Alliance
- Should anyone wish to help sponsor a family or two, send checks to KCCA at P.O. Box 1109, Brackettville, TX 78832
- Food is distributed to over 200 households in Kinney County who are eligible members of our client list
- Distribution is at St. Johns Missionary Church on the third Thursday of each month and bread from HEB stores in Del Rio is distributed on Fridays from 11 a.m. until the bread is gone

Put puzzle pieces together

Unless you keep track of obscure holidays, you may not be aware that Jan. 29 is National Puzzle Day.
