City election challengers oust incumbents

Challengers Tencha Pena and Rachel Munoz defeated the incumbents in the Brackettville city council election on May 14.

On an all-female ticket, Tencha Pena defeated Nancy Mendoza for Place 1. Pena garnered 86 votes during the early election period and 77 votes on Election Day, for a total of 163 votes. Mendoza received 85 votes during the early election

and 53 votes on Election Day, for a total of 138 votes. Mendoza was appointed to serve on the council two years ago.

Rachel Munoz defeated long time councilwoman Mary Flores for Place 3. Munoz gleaned the most votes during the election with 138 early votes and 92 votes on Election Day, for a total of 230 votes. Flores received 34 votes during the early election period and 36 votes on Election Day, for a total of 70 votes. Results are unofficial until

they are canvassed at a Special meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 24 at 6 p.m. at the City Annex and Pena and Munoz will be sworn in.

The school board election is normally held in conjunction with the city council election each year, however, none of the school board incumbents were opposed and an election was not necessary. School board members Brad Coe, Dan Laws and Mark Frerich have or will soon reaffirm their oath of office.

Don't judge a book by it's cover...

Inside an older county building dedicated in 1982, lives and breathes a modern, digital library that has also become a hub for community outreach services.

Kinney County Librarian Sarah Terrazas knows keeping a small-town library up to date and off the budget chopping block is a must do in today's fast paced technological world and hard economic times.

Under her quiet, librarian exterior, there lies a determined, forward-thinking woman who has dedicated the last 17 years to serving the literary needs of Kinney County. Terrazas has expanded the library's services from its daily book loans to include a full fledged cyber cafe. As the Librarian, Terrazas became aware that many of the library patrons needed more than a book to read or time on the computer. Many needed job placement assistance, basic computer training and a way to complete their high school educa-

tions. She began reaching out and found many public and private agencies were more than willing to help local residents, but did not have a place in which to meet with them and service their needs.

Terrazas said at first, she would go to the internet to try and find what was available to help solve the problem. She would then make a few phone calls or schedule a meeting. Now Terrazas, and a staff she praised for their willingness to step out of the box and help others, have developed a list of names and contact numbers they can offer a patron when they come. The library has a binder in which they keep numbers for Veteran's services, youth job services, utility bill assistance services, as well as many other numbers to give to those who may be looking for answers to a question.

Most recently the library participated in a tax return completion project sponsored VITA and the IRS. Local volunteers were trained and completed 76 tax returns that brought \$69,779 back to Kinney County residents. The VITA program offered the tax services free of charge.

Terrazas said she continually looks for ways to improve the library and feels blessed to be able to help others.

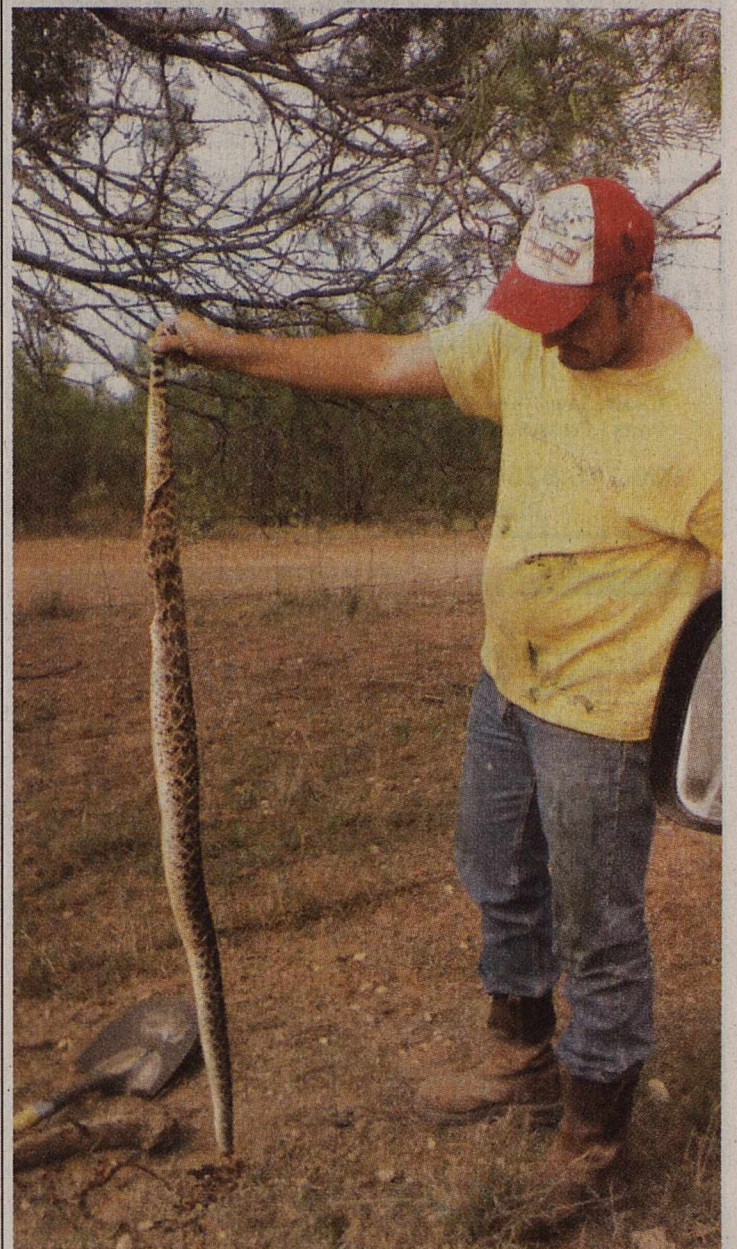

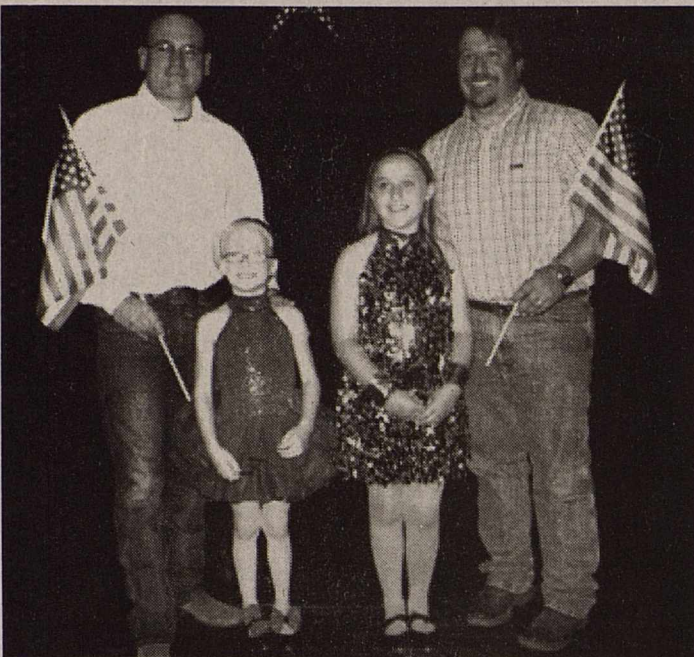
