The library has a binder in which they keep numbers for Veteran's services, youth job services, utility bill assistance services, as well as many other numbers to give to those who may be looking for answers to a question.

Most recently the library participated in a tax return completion project sponsored VITA and the IRS. Local volunteers were trained and completed 76 tax returns that brought \$69,779 back to Kinney County residents. The VITA program offered the tax services free of charge.

Terrazas said she continually looks for ways to improve the library and feels blessed to be able to help others.
