He loves this town and works hard at his job as manager. Lets not let a late comer sell our water and leave us a barren desert. Remember this when the time comes to mark your ballot. We have a good mayor. Lets keep Zandra Negrete in office.

Those of us running for office against the incumbents will probably not have a voice after this week. As much as we all would like to think it was someone else's fault that our community has gotten in the shape it is in, the ultimate responsibility falls to us - the voter. My response to their tactics is the same as it has always been: Right's Right and Wrong's Wrong. If you do what you've always done, you will get what you've always got. If you vote for the incumbents, you will continue to get what you've gotten for more years than you can count - no accounting for where YOUR money is spent, no new business in town, no street repairs and no respect for your needs or your opinions. I urge you to vote for me and for the 3 other candidates who support my 12-point program for bringing renewed life to our community. The time to step up is now. Please vote for Kent Lowery for Mayor. "Productivity appraisal" may lower the property taxes on your farm, ranch or timberland!

Texas law allows farmers, ranchers, wildlife managers and timber growers to pay property taxes based upon the productivity value of their land rather than on market value. This means qualified land is taxed based on its ability to produce crops, livestock or timber—not on its value on the real estate market. And it can mean substantial property

When is the application deadline?

If your land has never had a productivity appraisal or you are a new owner, you must apply to your local appraisal your 2012 property taxes. You may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason and ask for it before May 1. If you miss this deadline, you may still be able to apply, but you will pay a penalty. Check with your appraisal district office.

Do you need to reapply annually?

If your land already receives agricultural or timber productivity appraisal, you normally don't need to reapply unless the chief appraiser requires you to do so. If a new application is required, the appraisal district will notify you by mail.







Remember to "Render!" **Taxable property renditions** are due April 16.

Does this apply to you?

If you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income, such as the equipment or inventory owned by a business, it does.

What is a rendition?

A rendition is a report to your county appraisal district that lists all of the taxable property that you owned or controlled on Jan. 1 of this year. This often applies to furniture, fixtures, equipment or inventory owned by a business.

What are the advantages of filing?

You give your opinion of your property's value.

You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the

 If your property's value depreciated, you can file a report of decreased value.

What is the deadline?

The last day for filing 2012 renditions is April 16.

An automatic extension is available if requested in writing by the April

 The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days after the deadline for an owner who shows good cause in writing.

Filing is your responsibility. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, you may face a 10 to 50 percent penalty.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB)

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening or on a Saturday or Sunday. Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the evidence the CAD plans to introduce at the hearing to establish any matter at issue. The law provides that before a hearing on a protest or immediately after the hearing begins, you or your agent and the CAD shall each provide the other with a copy of any written material intended to be offered or submitted to the ARB at the hearing. To the greatest extent practicable, the hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. In most cases, the CAD has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented.

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court or an Arbitrator or SOAH

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 60 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. In certain cases, as an alternative to filing an appeal in district court, you may file, not later than the 45th day after you receive notice of the ARB order, a request for binding arbitration with the county appraisal district. In certain cases originating in certain counties, as an alternative to filing an appeal in district court, you may appeal to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH). An appeal to SOAH is initiated by, not later than the 30th day after you receive notice of the ARB's order, filing with the chief appraiser of the county appraisal district a notice of appeal. Appeals to District Court, Binding Arbitration, or SOAH all require payment of certain fees

You must pay either the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes due on the property under the order from which the appeal is taken.

RRC Production statistics and allowables for April

Submitted by Texas Railroad Commission

AUSTIN -- The Texas average rig count as of March 16 was 921, representing about 48 percent of all active land rigs in the United States. In the last 12 months, total Texas reported production was 403 million barrels of oil and 7.1 trillion cubic feet of natural gas. The Commission's estimated final production for January 2012 is 36,934,290 barrels of crude oil and 513,349,055 Mcf (thousand cu-

bic feet) of gas well gas. The Commission derives final production numbers by multiplying the preliminary January 2012 production totals of 33,012,415 barrels of crude oil and 458,962,052 Mcf of gas well gas by a production adjustment factor of 1.1188 for crude oil and 1.1185 for gas well gas. (These production totals do not include casinghead gas or condensate.)

Texas natural gas storage reported to the Commission for February 2012 was 359,565,528 Mcf compared to 282,505,230 Mcf in February 2011. The March 2012 gas storage estimate is 363,216,147 Mcf. The Texas Railroad Commission's Oil and Gas Division set initial April 2012 natural gas production allowables for prorated fields in the state to meet market demand of 10,063,648 Mcf (thousand) cubic feet). In setting the initial April 2012 allowables, the Commission used historical production figures from previous months, producers' demand forecasts for the coming month, and adjusted the figures based on well capability. These initial allowables will be adjusted after actual production for April 2012 is reported.

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB*

Usual Deadline was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good

Late protests are due the day before the ARB approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is not later than the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is not later than the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

> If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1) or no later than the 125th day after the date you claim you received a tax bill from one or more of the taxing units that tax your property. The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

* The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or notiday.


