The Times does not pretend to know whether the above statement is correct or not, but it is inclined to believe Wichita Falls, Tex., May 24, 1907. that it is. It does know, however, that there are entirely too many homicides committed and too few convictions, and is under the impression that the fault for so few convictions can properly be laid at the door of our higher courts. The dockets of the higher courts are always crowded and it does not seem to make much difference how many new ones are created for the purpose of relieving the situadon, the courts continue to act slower and slower. From one to a half dozen years is usually required to get a final decision in a murder case. If the defendant has money, and has sense nough to employ shrwed counsel, he usually comes out a free man.




