AWFUL HOLOCAUST AT CLEVE LAND, OHIO, TODAY.

Children and Teachers Thrown Into a Wild Panic and Scores Are Trampled and Burned.

BULLETIN-Cleveland, O., Mar. 4 .-Between fifty and seventy-five children were either burned or crushed to death in a fire and panic which occurred at the Lakeview school in Collinwood, a suburb of this city, this morning.

BULLETIN-Up to 1 o'clock this afternoon sixty bodies had been recovered from the ruins.

BULLETIN-At 1:45 this afternoon seventy-one bodies had been removed from the ruins.

BULLETIN-Principal Frank H. Whitney of the Collinwood school, estimates the dead at from seventy-five to one hundred.

Cleveland, Ohio, Mar. 4:- In the most terrible holocaust in the history of this section of the country, at least 121 school children lost their lives today in a fire which destroyed the three-story brick school building on Collamer avenue in Collinwood, a suburb just outside the city limits.

The fire started in the basement of the building at about 10 o'clock, just after the school had convened. It was caused from an over-heated furnace. The smoke from the fire quickly filled the building and alarmed the children and teachers and a panic ensued. - No. fire drill was used in rescuing the children and they rushed pell mell for thedoors and windows.

whose two children lost their lives in the building, was one of the first on the scene.

He stated that the rear door, one of the two exits, was locked, and the children rushed for the front and rear doors, and the front exit was soon jammed full of fighting and panic stricken humanity...

Many who reached the exit first escaped, but the greater number who followed choked the doorways and those who feil were trampled under foot and many are supposed to have been killed in this manner.

Those behind turned and made for the windows, and some on the second and third floors jumped from the windows and escaped in this way. Three or four were killed, while the others were more fortunate and escaped with only slight injuries.

The greater number of those who met death were cut off from escape by the smoke which blinded them. Men went to work in an effort to res-(Continued on Page 8.)

cue the little ones a few minutes after the building was known to be on fire. The school was surrounded by fathers and mothers who were frantic in their dazed efforts to rescue the children. Very few were saved from among the children who were behind the jam

at the front door. Others escaped with slight injuries. The school was of common grade and contained 360 children, ranging from 6 years to 14 years of age.

Twoor three teachers are also thought to have perished.

When the children rushed from their rooms to the hallways they rushed into a ffery furnace. It was in the hallways and at the main exit where the greatest number met their death.

Among the dead are the two Buschman girls, 10 and 12 years of age: Hugh McIlrath, 10 years old; Thomas Thompson, 9; Mary Ridgeway, 10; Eddie Kehl, 11; Anna Roth, 10; Rostoch, 10: Gertrude Davis, 12: two Woodmeyer girls, 10 and 12; Harold Anderson, 12.
