The Gainesville Messenger is urging the Commercial Club of that city to work on trade excursion into Gainesville, arguing that great benefits will be derived by the Gainesville merchants and the business men in general. The suggestion is being received very favorably and it is probable that it will be adopted. No town in Texas is better situated as a trading center than Wichita Falls and the many railroads radiating in every direction from this city into splendid trade territory offer an exceptional opportunity for trade excursions. No doubt, advantageous rates can be secured from all the railroads and great crowds of people with money to buy merchandise could be brought into the city. Right now at the opening of the spring season is an opportune time for such excursions and if the matter is properly presented, the times believes that the suggestion can be carried out with great success.

Chicago is now laying plans to rid herself of the "alien anarchists." This should be done, and the move is commendable, but while Chicago is doing this good work she should not stop with hiding herself of the "alien" class of anarchists, but the home-grown product also. The concern that makes a business of working poor, ignorant pauper labor, imported for the purpose, and paid wages that are hardly sufficient to keep soul and body together

while at work, and closes down suddenly, throwing thousands of penniless men, women and children out of employment is responsible to a very large degree for the growth of anarchy in the United States. Concerns that make a business of importing foreign labor make enormous dividends, but their method of doing it is questionable, to say the least. When the government at Washington allows these large concerns to import its labor, it should also see to it that this labor is given regular employment at reasonable wages the year round. By such a law the growth and spread of anarchy would be dealt an effective blow.

(Continued from Page 1.)

cue the little ones a few minutes after the building was known to be on fire. The school was surrounded by fathers and mothers who were frantic in their dazed efforts to rescue the children. Very few were saved from among the children who were behind the jam at the front door.

Others escaped with slight injuries. The school was of common grade and contained 360 children, ranging from 6 years to 14 years of age.

Two or three teachers are also thought to have perished.

When the children rushed from their rooms to the hallways they rushed into a fiery furnace. It was in the hallways and at the main exit where the greatest number met their death.

Among the dead are the two Buschman girls, 10 and 12 years of age; Hugh McIlrath, 10 years old; Thomas Thompson, 9; Mary Ridgeway, 10; Eddie Kehl, 11; Anna Roth, 10; Rostoch, 10; Gertrude Davis, 12; two Woodmeyer girls, 10 and 12; Harold Anderson, 12. Among the missing are Lizzie Lyon, Emma Heinge, Peter Heninger. The injured—Glen Barber, 10 years old; Mildred Schmidt, 10; Walter Herter, Helen Herter, Martha Herter, Werner Herter.

Four children of the janitor of the building lost their lives together in the fire.
