




LISA HROMAS







Last Tuesday, January 21, the Bovina Mustangs improved their district record to 3-2 at the midway point of the district battle.

The 'Stangs defeated Highland Park 65-58 as the star combo of Tony Beauchamp and Luke Steelman pumped in 22 and 19 points respectively. Their season record is now 14-5.

At the halfway point in district 3-2A, Lockney is 5-0, Bovina 3-2, Highland Park, Hale Center, & Hart are at 2-3, and Olton is 1-4.

Coach Derrick Byrd says that the district has good parity and the last half of district play is basically up for grabs. Even some of Lockney's wins have been by a margin of 2-4 points.


