Mitchell began working for the Texas Highway Department (now the Texas Department of Transportation) in October 1973 in the Materials and Test section in Austin. She worked there until transferring to the Austin Design Division in March 1974.

On Dec. 1, 1980, Brenda began her tenure with the Abilene District working in the right of way section and the district design office. She served in that capacity until July 1990 at which time she was selected as the Executive Assistant to the District Engineer. In addition to her duties as the executive assistant, Mitchell also

served as the district traffic safety coordinator. During her career as the executive assistant, Mitchell worked for five district engineers.

Prior to joining TxDOT, Mitchell worked in Austin for the Texas Department of Public Safety for four years.

A 1968 graduate of Winters High School, Mitchell served on the Baird City Council for more than nine years.

## Being A Father

What quality do these have in common: the marmosets, siamangs, sea horses and jacanas? The male of each of these species takes care of the young.

Dads have a wonderful opportunity to encourage, to teach, to counsel, to warn and to model the Christian life for their children. Deut. 6:7 spells out the tasks a father has to teach his children. Paul states in Ephesians 6:4 that fathers should rear their children "in the training and admonition of the Lord" and he also told fathers to not provoke their children.

An author named Neil Chethik wrote a book about the way sons cope with the deaths of their dads. He studied 300 men and found that 65% said their fathers deaths affected them more than other deaths in their lives. Each man experienced a significant change.

We read in Genesis 50:1 that when Jacob died, Joseph, in his great loss, "fell on his father's face, wept over him and kissed him." The period of mourning and burial lasted more than 2 months.

A story is told of a young man who stood at the bar of Justice to be sentenced for forgery. The judge had known the young man from childhood for the boys' father had been a famous legal light and his work on the Law of Trusts was the most exhaustive work on the subject. "Do you remember your father?" asked the judge sternly, "that father whom you have disgraced?" The prisoner answered, "I remember him perfectly. When I went to him for advice or companionship, he would look up from his book on the Law of Trusts and say, 'Run away, boy, I am busy'. My father finished his book, and here I am." The great lawyer had neglected his own trust with awful results. (From Public Speakers Library).

There is a part of Hebrews 12 which applies to all Christians, but seems to apply especially to dads. In verses 14 and 15 it suggests that all people be grateful and rely on the grace of God and not have anger or bitterness. Then in Ephesians 6:4 Paul tells us that dads should bring up their children with their opportunity to model the Christian life for them. Verse 7 spells out the task of a dad to teach his children.

"Fathers, give your children guidance And instruction from God's Word; Then with wisdom and compassion Teach them how to love the Lord." (Sper)

Truly a Christlike example is a Father's greatest gift to his children, for being a father is a job of strength, gentleness, courage and faith. This role is not easy, but the lives of fathers are enriched when they prepare their children for life.

Children need attention, guidance and care. God will help a dad guard his children from harm. Sper also wrote:

"God gives us children for a time To train them in His way, To love them and to teach them how To follow and obey."

The character of a child tomorrow depends on what is put into the heart today.

From early times, Christian homes have been centers of worship. Right Christian living begins in the home and experiences there help children grow in faith and knowledge of God! A Christian parent can see that their children grow in wisdom, stature and in favor with God. When a father is the spiritual leader of the home, it is a great blessing for the family members to be able to have fellowship together in the spirit of Christ!

### Happy Birthday, Gwendolyn Brooks!

Remember that poetry is life distilled.

—Gwendolyn Brooks

June 7, 2009, would have been Gwendolyn Brooks's 92nd birthday; to join us in celebrating one of America's greatest poets, check out the Hall Library stop on the Chicago Poetry Tour, which features archival recordings of Brooks reading from and speaking about the impressive span of her work. The program ranges from the intimate neighborhood portraits included in her first collection, *A Street in Bronzeville*, such as "kitchenette building" and "the rites for Cousin Vit," to the political turn her poetry took in the '60s as she became involved with the black arts movement:

And we did such exciting things. And we went into the park and recited our poetry and we went to city jail. And the most exciting thing we did was just to walk into a tavern, and someone like Haki Madhubuti, once known as Don L. Lee, would say, "Look folks, we're gonna lay some poetry on you!" . . . And they would turn from their drinks, temporarily, and listen to poetry, which they hadn't come to the tavern to hear, of course.

The Poetry Foundation website offers a critical biography of Brooks, as well as contemporary articles, including Danielle Chapman's "Sweet Bombs," a review of the recently issued collection *The Essential Gwendolyn Brooks*.

For a broader look at Brooks's effect on Chicago poetry, listen to "Confronting the Warland," an original one-hour radio documentary produced by the Poetry Foundation. The show presents African American poets who have found influence and inspiration living in the city, and features Brooks, Tyehimba Jess, Quraysh Ali Lansana, Haki Madhubuti, Sterling Plumpp, and Margaret Walker in interviews, readings, and archival recordings.

Finally, Brooks is showcased in the *Essential American Poets* archive, selected by Donald Hall during his poet laureateship in 2006. Recorded at the Library of Congress in 1961, Brooks, in her early 30s, reads several poems not available on the Chicago Poetry Tour, including "the mother," "of De Witt Williams on his way to Lincoln Cemetery," and "A Sunset of the City," which ends,

Tin intimations of a quiet core to be my  
Desert and my dear relief

Come: there shall be such islanding from grief,  
And small communion with the master shore.

Twang they. And I incline this ear to tin,  
Consult a dual dilemma. Whether to dry  
In humming pallor or to leap and die.

Somebody muffed it? Somebody wanted to joke.

to a blacksmith. The master blacksmith taught the apprentice how to hold the tongs, lift the sledge, strike the anvil and to use the bellows to make a white-hot flame so they could shape the metal into useful tools.

Soon the thrilled and excited young man became sad, for he discovered that the master blacksmith had taught him how to handle the tools, but had forgotten to show him how to handle the spark. How often parents teach children skills, attitudes, health and safety rules, but fail to give them the spark that gives meaning to all of life.

A good way to inspire the children of a family to worship and pray together in the home is for God to bless family leaders with a spark that gives meaning to life.

The prodigal son sought freedom and happiness in many places, but what he sought was right in his father's house.

But I am well pleased because you were willing to sacrifice it all to spend your life among those spiritually and otherwise needy people. Remain true at all costs to them, even though it may mean hardship and suffering and possible, even death at their hands. I am confident you will never dishonor yourself by proving unfaithful."
