Only six Members of Congress were defeated in 1988 , and of this
number, five were facing crimina indictments at the time of election! Since challengers face such "stacked deck," fewer are running each election. In fact, almost 20 per cent of House incumbents had Political Action Committee (PACs) contributed a total of $\$ 1$ million to these Congressmen running unopposed.
