Why Our Reilroads Are Narrow Gauge. Why are all railroads built on the standard gauge of four feet eight and one-half inches? The makers of the first locomotives thought only of putting their machines upon the tramways already in existence, and from curious result. These tram lines naturally had exactly the width prescribed by the strength of one horse. By mere inertia the horse cart gauge established itself in the world, and everywhere the train is dwarfed to a scale that limits alike its comfort, power and speed. Because there is so much capital engaged and because of the there will ever be any change in this gauge. Still, it might be worse. If the biggest horses had been Shetland ponies our railway carriages now would only be wide enough to hold two persons side by side and would have a maximum speed of twenty miles an honr. These grains are very hardy. They can be planted early and late. They develop with a small amount of moisture and a minimum amount of labor. They make a good deal more to the acre than corn and with nearly as good a price they will prove much more profitable crops. If the market happens to be poor they can be fed and a market realized in that way.

There is a determination among farmers to break away from the bondage of cotton. This year seems to be a poor one thus far for wheat and oats. A good substitute will be Kaffir corn or maize. If the market for these should remain anything like it is now there would be more money in raising these crops than there is in cotton at the present low prices. Kaffir corn makes good feed for horses, cattle,

hogs, chickens, etc. The flour mill here expects this year to furnish a market for all the Kaffir corn and maize that may be raised in

this grain and that it could easily be product,-Baylor County Banner.





Here on this farm, one hundred ears ago today, was born the strongest gentlest character the republic has ever known. His work was destined to have a more far-reaching influence than any that went before him. Until recently this spot which should be hallewed by every American, was unnoticed and abandoned. Inspired by the human liberty, who sprang from this and will remain for several days. soil demanded the preservation of his birth place, a few patriotic men organized the Lincoln Farm Association to purchase this property and to erect upon it a memorial to that simple, but sublime life that here came into the world. This Association is purely patriotic in its purposes and the movement has met with a ready response from every section of the nation. The governors of nearly all the States have appointed commissioners to co-operate this work. The South has responded as generously as the North. In revering the name of Lincoln, there is now no North or South nor East nor West. There is but one heart in all, and that the heart of patriotic America. So the memorial to be erected here by South as well as North will not only be in memory of Lincoln, but it will be a testimony that the fires of hatred kindled by the fierce civil conflict of nearly half a century ago, are dead and from patriotism to a common country and leyalty to a common flag: It will be a monument in the forward progress

It is appropriate that these dedication exercises, participated in by repgesentatives of every part of the nation, should be held upon the centenary of Lincoln's birthday. We have not come so much to dedicate this ground, but to set it apart as a gift to the American people as a lasting memorial to the matchless American. The man born here has already consecrated this place. It is for us to be here dedicated to the great task before us, that this nation should not be preserved merely to fall before the enemies of peace, but that it shall be made free from the things that dishonor and oppress.
